**GATHER FOR FIGHT
ON TUBERCULOSIS**

BERLIN, Oct. 27, (Special)—The deep interest taken by the German Empress in the endeavors to combat the scourge of tuberculosis was displayed today when she attended the formal opening of the International Tuberculosis Conference here, at which delegates from twenty-two nations are in attendance. The Empress had given her name as patroness of the conference, whose meetings are being held in the halls of the Prussian Diet.

The Imperial Vice-Chancellor, Herr Clemens Delbrueck, welcomed the delegates and paid tribute to the extraordinary energy and success with which the fight against consumption

TESTED RECIPES

LAMB COLLOPS AND ASPARAGUS

Cut underdone lamb into fillets about two and half inches in diameter, sprinkle on both sides with a seasoning made by mixing one tablespoon of flour, a quarter teaspoon of powdered mixed herbs, quarter teaspoon of salt, an eighth of pepper and a pinch of grated lemon rind, and lay aside for one hour. Cut the tops of the asparagus about two inches long and boil them in salted water until tender, the stems being left aside to be afterwards used for soup. Heat an ounce and a half of butter in a frying pan cook the collops until well browned in it, then remove and keep them hot. Sprinkle half an ounce of flour on the bottom of the pan, cook until well browned, add a pint of stock or for five minutes, then strain. Arrange the collops in a close circle in a hot dish, place asparagus tip in centre, and pour the sauce around.

SMALL CUCUMBER PICKLES

Lay firm, small cucumbers of uniform size, none of them more than three inches long, in a large earthen crock, with a layer of salt on every layer of cucumbers. Pack in enough cold water to cover them, placing a heavily weighted plate on top to prevent floating. Every other day stir the pickles up from the bottom, and leave them in the brine for ten days. At the end of this time pour it off and pick out the pickles, throwing out those that are soft. Put those which are left in fresh water and leave them in this twenty-four hours change again to fresh water, and let them lie in this another day. Line your kettle with grape leaves and place the cucumbers on these, sprinkling each layer of them with a little powdered alum, pour in cold water, lay several thicknesses of the leaves over the top, cover the kettle closely, and simmer slowly for six hours. Don't let the kettle boil. Take out the cucumbers, which now should be well drained, throw them in cold water and leave them in this for a couple of hours. Prepare a thick pickle vinegar of one cup of sugar, a dozen blades of mace, a dozen and a half whole all-spice, three dozen each of whole black pepper and cloves, and four quarts of vinegar. Boil all these together for five minutes after the boil begins.

If boiled potatoes have to stand a while before being served, cover them over with a thick cloth and stand the pan where they will keep warm but will not scorch. The cloth absorbs the moisture and helps to make the potatoes floury.

When making Yorkshire puddings and pancakes, mix the flour with water instead of milk, break the eggs into the basin and beat all together thoroughly. It will be found much lighter and cheaper, less milk being required.
