The Evangelical Churchmen say: We are glad to learn that French protestantism is now active in Montreal at present. The Roman Catholic mission for Protestants now in progress has no doubt stirred them up. At a special service in memory of the late Dr. Chiquiquy, held in St. John's Church, the Rev. Dr. Amaron said, that since Dr. Chiquiquy's death, Roman Catholics had made strenuous efforts to convert Protestants. Nearly every French Protestant family in the city of Montreal, had been visited by Roman clergy, soliciting them to return to Romanism, but without success. The French Protestant churches have arranged for a series of union meetings for the purpose of grounding their own people in the truth, and thus reaching also many of their Roman Catholic countrymen. In Montreal there are said to be eight French churches and missions and four thousand five hundred French Protestants.

MANY of the leading sports of Kingston met a few evenings ago and discussed horse racing, etc., and as a result some lively trotting may be heard of in the near future, as some fast horses are owned in Kingston. In the mean time a good deal of speculating is being indulged in.

THE widow and children of the late F. S. Robb have presented the Presbyterian Church of Amherst with a memorial window. The window is designed to represent the Sermon on the Mount, and from the three central truths of the Sermon on the Mount the preacher preached. The late Mr. Robb was well known throughout the province and visited Charlottetown during a session of the M. Y. M. C. A. held here a few years ago.

MR. FRED. WESTLAKE of the firm of Westlake Bros., will leave by to-night's eastbound train for Georgetown where he will cross to-morrow to the Minto route to Montreal, Toronto, and other leading Canadian cities on a four weeks business trip. While away Mr. Westlake will visit the leading studios and study the latest designs. He will also purchase the latest appliances for the operating room which will include a series of back grounds. Since opening business in May last Messrs. Westlake Bros. have given the utmost satisfaction to their many customers and when Mr. Westlake returns they will have the advantage of procuring the latest in Charlottetown.

A series of match skating races between Harley Davidson of this city and Baptie, Tom Eck's record-breaker, is being arranged. Davidson challenged the speedy Milwaukee skater some time ago, and yesterday he received a letter at Fergus, where he meets Jones and others to-morrow night, from Tom Eck accepting the def. Eck wrote that he has forwarded \$100 to Angus McLeod to build the match, and Davidson says that he will cover the amount just as soon as the stakeholder receives it. The races which will be held on February 14, 15 and 16 at the Mutual Street Rink, will be at three distances 1/2 mile, 1 mile and 5 miles, best two in three each night. Eck stipulates that the men skate from opposite sides of the rink, but Davidson is not satisfied with this condition. He will skate the half mile this way, but he wants the mile skated in the ordinary fashion and the style in five miles determined by the toss of a coin. John Davidson and his sister Fanny, are in Paris, France, giving exhibitions of fancy skating.—Toronto Globe Feb. 1.

The following is an extract from a letter of Rev. S. H. Rice, Souris, P. E. I., written to the Wesleyan:—I have recently been very deeply impressed with the thought that great dignity and honor involve very great responsibilities and sometimes severe suffering and bereavement. At the time of the wonderful demonstration in London, Lord Roberts received a greater ovation than any other person, our beloved Queen alone excepted. Now, after losing his only son and heir, as well as his nephew, he has gone forth to jeopardize his own life to uphold the honor of his country. Lord Dufferin also, who has occupied the most dignified position in the gift of the British crown, has been called to mourn the loss of his son, and so with many others of a less noted character. Yes! the "white man's burden" has to be borne and the load just now is very heavy. The poet's magnificent lines come to us with more than ordinary force and meaning at this eventful period of the national history:—"The warlike of the isles, The men of field and wave, Are not the rock: their funeral piles The seas and shore their grave? Go, stranger, track the deep, Free, free, the white sail spread, Waves may not foam, nor wild winds sweep, Where sleep no: England's dead.
