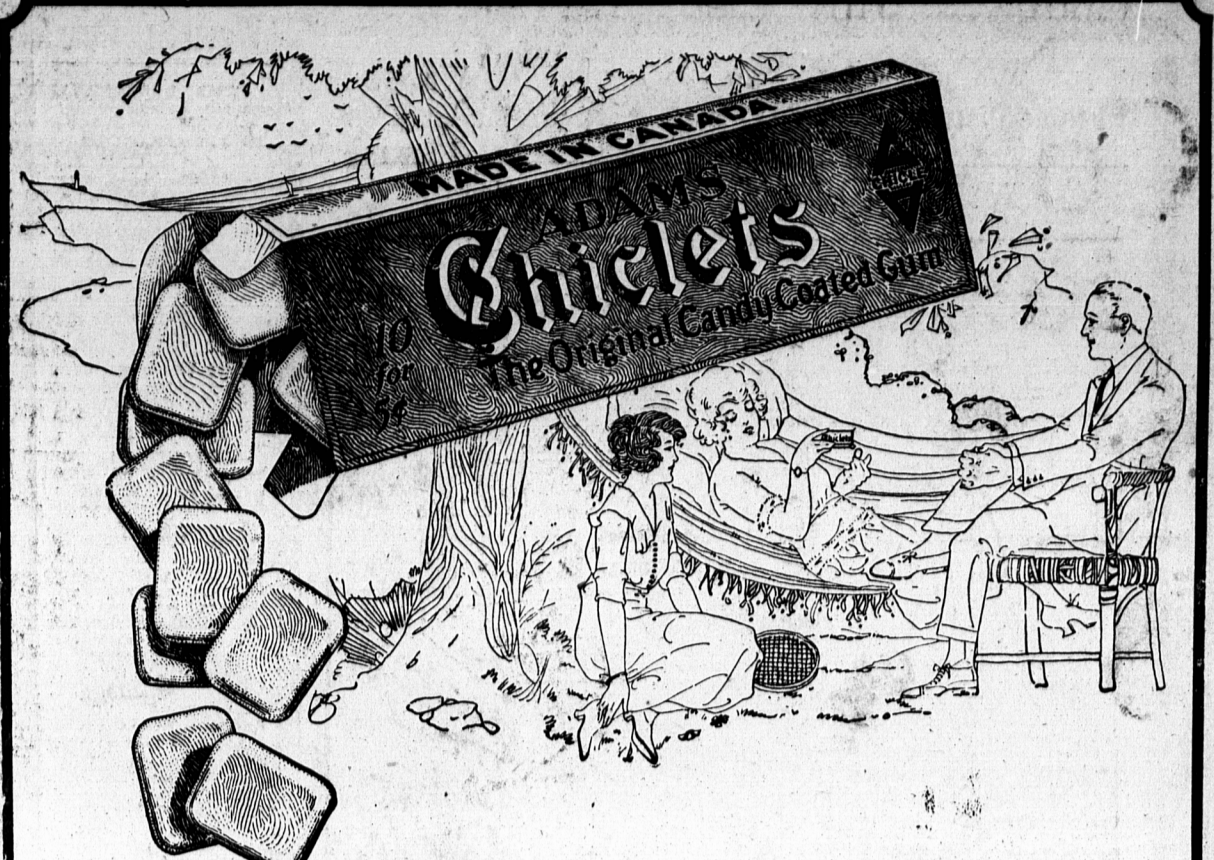
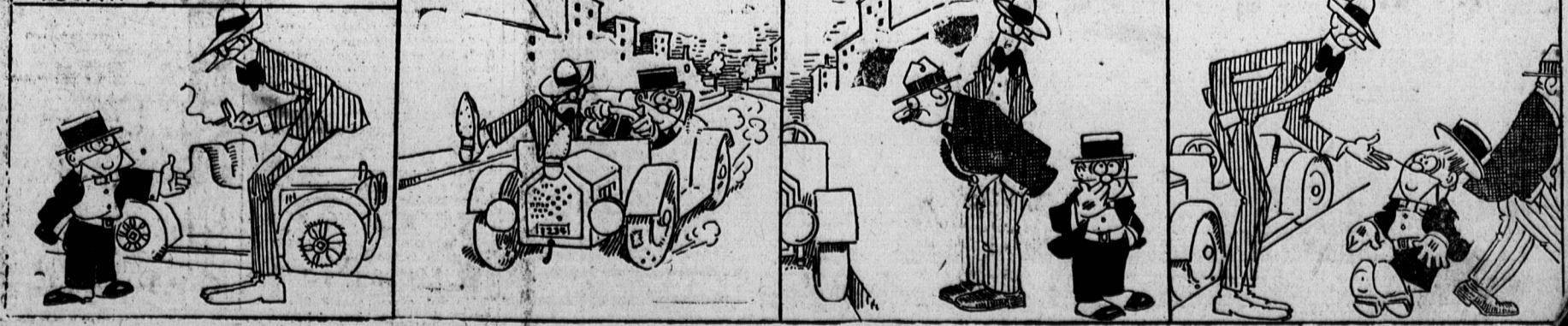

Appelby and Walter Lawson, Jr. Miss Appelby recognized Garfield as he was at a railway flag station at Stewart Town, Halton county, and informed J. A. Tracy, clerk of

Esqueping township, and Mr. Appelby. These two men with Walter Lawson's assistance, effected the arrest of the escaped prisoner.
