GOLDWIN SMITH IS IN LONDON
He Gives His Views on matters Relating to Dominion of Canada.

LONDON, Sept. 13. Colonel Cross, secretary of the N. B. A., speaking to a representative of the Canadian Associated Press, said he had not heard even a whisper regarding a British team competing in the Palma trophy competition at Ottawa or any other place in 1907.
Prof. Goldwin Smith, interviewed for Canada by Robin Kingsmill, replying to a remark that he had been charged with being anti-Imperialist, said: "What is Imperialism? The only Imperialism I can understand is Imperialism such as that of Rome or Spain at the height of her golden days as a really all potent world power, an Imperialism with supreme omnipotent control centralized and applied to the Government of the whole Empire. I do not think that that is quite what Imperialists today desire, but it is my conception of genuine Imperialism."
As to Andrew Carnegie's plan of "Race compact," Prof. Smith expressed himself at a loss to understand what it meant. "I fail to understand" said he "how any scheme of British or Anglo-Saxons organic union can be made to work."
Referring to the Canadian West, Prof. Smith said, "It is well that the school system is to be English. By utility of language the polyglot population of the great West can be welded into any educative influence can weld it. In Canada the purely British people are now the minority. The vast French population added to the tens of thousands of representatives of a score of foreign nations, greatly outnumber the British. Of course I do not class as British, the Irish Roman Catholics and their descendants. It is a fact undeniable that Irish Roman Catholics are not British either blood, habit, or political aspirations, but the great matter is that the West will be English speaking; and an English-speaking West will always prosper."
Referring to the hope of Archbishop Tache that the rich land beyond the Great Lakes would be French-Canadian in population, Prof. Smith said the day had long gone past when there existed any prospect that such a hope would be gratified. "French-Canadian" said he, "have they enclaves at Quebec. They seem satisfied with it. Their leaders are able and earnest."
Prof. Smith's information was not sufficiently complete to permit the giving of an opinion on the question of Imperial trade, but he believed the reciprocity movement was making some progress.
