Boston, May 12.—Although only 16 years of age and totally ignorant of the ways of the world, an innocent, home-loving maiden, Marie de Boudrou, a French girl, has come from the far north on a mission which few women would dare undertake.

Marie de Boudrou is a girl of indomitable spirit. She is a God-fearing girl. She says her father certainly had no reason to commit suicide, and he loved his wife too well to court the favor of other women.

She will search until she finds him, she says.

### PRODUCE MARKETS

Not a Great Deal Doing in Cheese—Butter Remains About the Same.

MONTREAL, May 12.

There was a fair amount of trading at the cheese boards yesterday, at prices ranging from 9c to 9 3/8c. On spot there is very little doing, and 9c to 9 1/2c is about the range for white and colored.

Butter is without any special change. In an export way sales have been made at 15 3/4c to 16c, and boxes of creamery in a jobbing way are quoted at 16 1/2c.

Dairy stock is still very quiet. An active business was done in eggs to-day, there being a good demand, and the tone of the market was steady. Sales of choice stock were made at 11c, and No. 2. at 9 1/2 to 10 per dozen.
