MONTREAL, March 27—(CP)—Prices held steady Saturday in light trading on Canadian commodity exchange.

Butter spot—New Zealand finest 35 3-4-3; Australian 35 3-4-3.

Eggs spot Ont A-large 23a; A-medium 22a; A-pullets 21a.

MONTREAL, March 27—(CP)—Butter prices ruled firm on Montreal open produce markets last week. Eggs turned a little lower and cheese gained a fraction of a cent.

Butter was quoted at 36-38 1-4 nominal for No 1 in cartons or less with lots to retailers at 36 1-2-37 for solids and 37-37 1-2 for prints.

Graded egg shipments in cartons or less were 23 cents a dozen for A-large, 22 for A-mediums and 20 for A-pullets.

Cheese was 15 1-2-3-4 cents a pound for current western makes.

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, March 27—Mixture of bullish and bearish cross winds caused nervous trading on Winnipeg grain exchange Saturday.

Changes in wheat futures, however, were confined to a one-cent range with values locally setting 1-8 to 5-8 cent lower, May 1.16 5-8, July 1.07 1-4 to 3-8, and Oct. 90 cents.

Decline of stock markets, lower Liverpool prices and forecast of unsettled weather in the United States southwest favored low prices but a scattering of export buying was encountered. Offerings generally were light.

Cash wheat holders failed to be inspired by good demand for cash wheat at unchanged spreads. Only a few carloads of red springs were reported sold.

Coarse grains averaged lower, taking a final dip at the close, oats 3-8 to 1-8 down, barley unchanged to 1-8 down, flax 1-2 down, and rye 5-8 to 7-8 lower.

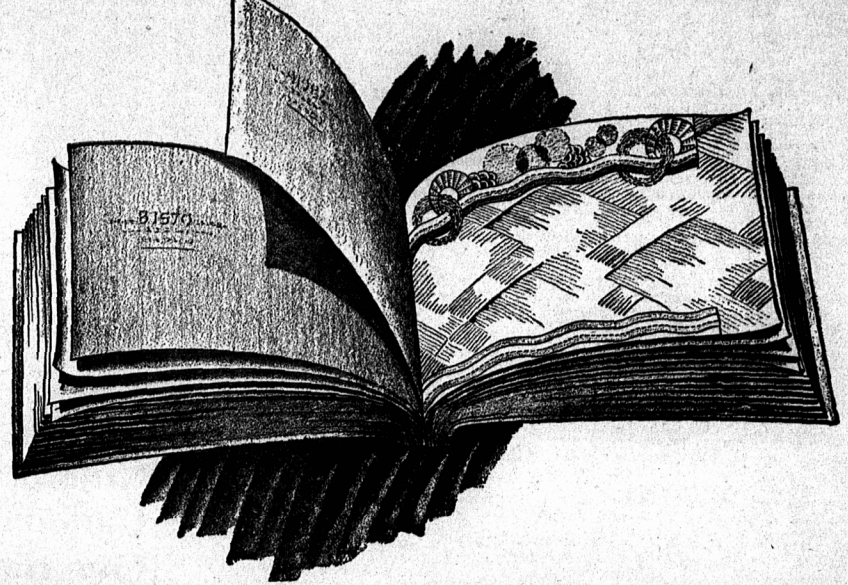

NEW YORK, March 27—Foreign currencies showed only small changes in terms of the United States dollar Saturday.

Sterling advanced 1-8 of a cent to 4.95 7-8 while the French franc ended unchanged at 3.02 1-2. The Holland Guilder gained .02 of a cent and the Swiss franc lost a similar amount. The belga rose 1/16 of a cent. The Canadian dollar was unchanged at 99 15-32.

The Pound Sterling advanced 1/16 of a cent to 84.98 7-16 on Montreal foreign exchanges while the French franc held about even. The United States dollar gained 1-8 per cent at 17-32 per cent premium.

Government Aid For Chicken Clubs

The Provincial Department of Agriculture is undertaking this year, as formerly, to pay \$4.00 per hundred on baby chicks for boys' and girls' clubs. The club shall consist of ten members, either boys or girls.

Chicks must be bought from Provincial Hatcheries, and whose eggs are all from blood tested flocks. Brooders would be necessary in successfully carrying out this work, and our Department has decided to stand half the cost of the heater for the brooder house; the balance to be paid by the owner of the club. Our Department would retain ownership in the heater for a period of three years. After the expiration of that time, the heater having been used for those three years would then become the property of the purchaser.

I would like the people to have an interest in poultry in this province, and many who have not thought of the matter up to the present time, to realize that the money brought into the province by the sale of eggs and poultry is a very substantial amount of the present revenue of the province, and when we come to realize that it is necessary for Prince Edward Island to import six carloads of western chickens in order to supply the requirements of the province, which include the necessary product used by canning factories; so that all can see the need for increased production.

Assuring all concerned in this matter of the co-operation of our Department and earnestly asking for an organization of the poultry growers of the province.
