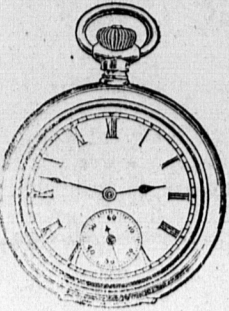

White oats yesterday were thirty-eight cents a bushel and black forty to forty-two cents.

There was no Supreme Court yesterday as the heating apparatus was not in working order.

Beatrice McKenzie, Hazelbrook, has returned home from a two months visit with friends in Massachusetts.

The cheese board meets in this City on Friday next, at 2 p. m. This will be the last meeting of the board this season.

Shippers are paying from eighteen to twenty-two cents per bushel for potatoes and ten to twelve cents for turnips.

Rev. F. M. Webster, Summerside; A. McConnell, Ontario and F. C. McGrath, Bloomfield, P. E. I., registered at the Victoria Hotel, City, yesterday morning.

Loose hay was forty-five to fifty cents per cwt yesterday and loose straw at twenty-five to thirty cents. Pressed hay was eight to nine dollars a ton and pressed straw five to six dollars.

The many friends of Mrs. Sullivan, wife of Chief Justice Sullivan, will be deeply pained to learn of her death, which took place at the Charlottetown Hospital shortly after midnight last night.

Among the arrivals registered at the Queen Hotel, City yesterday morning were W. F. Anderson, Montreal; L. Anderson, St. Peter's; C. C. Pratt, St. Peter's; Rev. Edwin Smith, Cardigan; Rev. John Stirling, Cavendish; J. H. Irving, Pownal; L. J. McDonald, Montreal and J. M. Clark, Summerside.

There was an exceptionally good market yesterday with quantities of chickens, ducks and geese offering. Butter was twenty four to twenty five cents per pound, eggs, twenty two to twenty four per dozen, geese one dollar to one ten cents, chickens fifty to seventy five cents a pair and ducks seventy to ninety cents a pair.

Miss Gordon, a member of a theatrical company, while at supper in the Corona Hotel, Montreal, recently found a pearl worth \$300 in a Malpeque oyster. The water attempted to take the pearl under the pretext that he only sold her oysters not pearls, but Miss Gordon succeeded in repulsing him. "I am thinking seriously," said the manager, "of leaving the theatrical business and organizing a company to search for pearls in Malpeque Bay."

The S. S. Cape Breton arrived in this port yesterday for Peake Bros. with a large general cargo. She sails today for St. John's, Nfld., with 6000 bags oats, 120 tons hay, 200 tons of vegetables, 400 bags potatoes, fifty sheep and butter, cheese, etc.

Through the kindness of an Ontario Methodist layman, Rev. George Orman was able to present the Methodist congregation at Vernon River and Cherry Valley, a supply of Methodist and Canadian Hymnals, the cost at wholesale figures aggregating nearly 20 dollars.

The coal boring operations at Easnescliffe were recently stopped on account of the hole filling up with water and mud. Contractor Stover, has sent to Pittsburgh, Pa., for nine hundred feet of casing, which will enable him to finish this job. He had gone down eighteen hundred feet when he stopped work.

The Plant line steamer Halifax, Captain Ellis, from Charlottetown and Port Hawkesbury, which should have arrived in Halifax Saturday evening and sailed for Boston, did not make Halifax until eleven o'clock Sunday morning having been thirty five hours on the voyage. She encountered the great storm that raged along the Nova Scotia coast and it was with the greatest difficulty she was kept on her course.—Halifax Herald.

Yesterday The Guardian received from Neil McKinnon, Riverdale and Lemuel Martin, South Granville, samples of the Alexandria apples. All the apples measured exactly thirteen inches in circumference and the largest of Mr. McKinnon's samples weighs exactly 1 3/4 ounces while the largest apple from South Granville weighs a fraction of an ounce more. 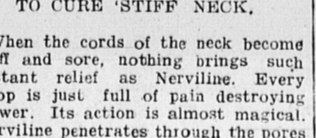
