UNION OFFICIAL IS HELD FOR MURDER

JERSEY CITY, N. J., Feb. 3.—A sequel to the shooting of Thomas

Conroy in a saloon row Saturday morning came to-day with the arrest of Peter P. Murphy, business agent of the Hoisting Engineers' Union of this city on a warrant charging conspiracy in an attempt to bring about the death of John W. Burke, a member of the same union.

Conroy was shot by mistake by one of several New York gangsters who came here in search of Burke, according to an alleged confession by one of the men arrested just after the shooting. This prisoner told how he and two others were hired to "get" a man answering to Burke's description.
