COAL BILL UNDERFIRE

(C. P. by Guardian's Special Wire)

LONDON, Nov. 12.—Colliery operators today attacked one of the major provisions of the Government's plan to assume ownership of all coal resources by the middle of 1942, but informed the Government they would not oppose the principle of the plan which provides that the Government take over the mines and lease them to the operators.

They voiced "various objections, however, to the provision for compulsory amalgamation, or grouping of the mines, which is included in the bill that will be introduced into the House of Commons. They expressed fear that under this provision they might be added unjustly with non-paying collieries."

Philip Gee of the Mining Association of Great Britain said: "One of the chief reasons put forward for amalgamation is that it will lower the cost of production of coal. This issue is to be left to the decision of Parliament. But it is a technical matter with which Parliament is not necessarily qualified to deal."

The mine operators contended that part of the 780,000 miners now working at top speed to supply domestic demands and increased exports might be thrown out of work if the amalgamation is carried out.

FINANCIAL NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK, Nov. 13.—Chester C. Davis, member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System in an address at El Paso said that a further increase in the price of gold is not likely although many of his friends were advocating such as the solution to halt the present business reaction. Mr. Davis emphatically stressed the point that monetary measures were not instrumental in the present business recession. If the remedy to halt the business recession lies in monetary action the Federal Reserve Board will not hesitate at any time to take or to recommend to the Government such action as they believe would help. Preparations being made among senators yesterday to resist U. S. Treasury recommendations for restrictions of the percentage depletion allowances of oil and mining operations now provided in the revenue laws.

President Roosevelt expects to meet with utility executives next week. Practical methods of carrying out a housing program are being studied. Congressional leaders are apparently anxious to take up the tax question before control and Wage and Hour Bills. Volume indications yesterday in the market continued favorable. We would expect the market today to be decidedly irregular although if volume continues small on the irregularity we would expect the market to attempt to do better next week.
