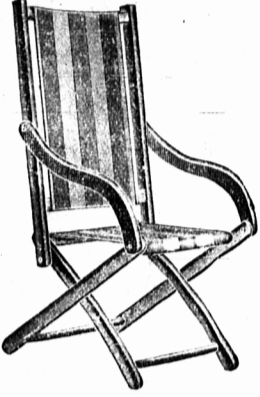

#### FISH CARRIES YOUNG

The Karatoo has always seemed to have the monopoly of that convenient way of carrying its babies in a pouch but it has been discovered that a fish has the same useful receptacle, which it uses for the same purpose. The pipe fish, as it is called from the length of its jaws, has a pocket on the under side of its body nearly half its length. It is found in the male species only and is the only part of its body which is unprotected by large flat plates, which take the place of

scales in its protective armor. If a pipefish is taken from the water and its little ones shaken out of the pouch back into the water they always seem either unable or disinclined to run away. But if the father is placed in the water again all the small fish immediately swim back into the pouch. These curious little creatures have prehensile tails, which they use to hold on to the seaweed to prevent themselves being carried away by the tide. The pipefish is similar to the small eel, being about a foot in length and an inch in thickness. But unlike the eel, it has a very long jaw and the peculiar defensive armor already mentioned.—New York "Tribune."
