BRANT ARRIVES: The C. G. S. Brant, which arrived on Friday evening from St. John, with Dominion Inspector of Lighthouses McPhail and Mr. John Kelley, Inspector of Lighthouses for New Brunswick, on board, left Summerside Saturday morning on an inspection trip of the different lighthouses on the north shore of New Brunswick.

FOXES HELD UP: The first hold up of foxes under the new regulations took place Saturday evening at Summerside when a pair of black foxes, owned by Mr. McRae of Alberton, which arrived by the Empress in charge of their owner, that evening, were taken in charge by the custom officials and held pending inspection, J.

HEAVY STORM: A heavy thunder and lightning storm, accompanied by a downpour of rain, the latter continuing throughout the day, passed over Summerside and the surrounding country on Saturday morning, being especially heavy around Egmont Bay, where a large barn belonging to Mr. Philip MacNally was struck and badly damaged.

WRECKED SCHOONER SOLD: The hull and running gear of the wrecked schooner, Sarah Townsend was sold at auction by Auctioneer Wright at Summerside on Saturday at noon. The hull with standing gear was sold to Joseph Read & Co. for \$37. This firm also bought the gasoline engine with hoisting gear attached for \$150.00, also a number of smaller sails, anchors and boat which were sold at very low prices. The mainsail, practically new, was sold to Ronald Campbell for \$65.00. During the last few days a large part of the cargo of lumber has been unloaded from the wrecked schooner and placed on cars and about one-third of the cargo yet remains to be unloaded. The hull is so badly wrecked, in the tow, and the remainder all twisted, that the future cannot be decided until all the cargo is unloaded.

S. A. SERVICE: The services in connection with the Salvation Army work in Summerside held in their New hall on Water St., yesterday, were largely attended, the hall being crowded at each service. At the forenoon service which was conducted by Major and Mrs. Taylor, assisted by Staff Captain and Mrs. Coombs, St. John, Adjutant Green, and Sergeant Allen, Sussex Capt and Mrs. Squarebriggs, Captain Robertson and Sergeant Derbyshire, Campbellton. The attendance was exceptionally large. Among those on the platform besides the officers and soldiers were Revs. A. B. Rice, and Dr. Thompson, Messrs. D. A. Pickering and A. S. McKay. After a short service of music and song, remarks were made by Staff Capt. Coombs, Mrs. Capt. Squarebriggs, Adjutant Reid, Revs. Thompson and Rice, and Messrs. McKay and Pickering, all of whom spoke in a complimentary way of the work of the Army and extended best wishes for the future work in the new hall. After the addresses the new officers, Captain Annie McKervy and Lieutenant Daisy Stevens were elected to the audience, both of whom made short addresses. This evening there will be another meeting at which Mrs. Coombs will deliver an address on her experience of years ago when engaged in army work in India, J.
