Billy Sunday Gets \$55,000 in Campaign

BOSTON, Jan. 23.—Billy Sunday the evangelist, was the beneficiary of the largest tree will offering in revival history yesterday, when the people of Boston and the vicinity presented him with at least \$55,000 on the last day of his great 10 weeks' revival.

Last night when he left Boston he carried with him a check of \$50,828.64 with collections in the suburban churches and countless other mail collections still to be heard from.

A collection of \$1600 from Tremont Temple had not been listed up to the time of making out the check, and it is conservatively estimated that the balance of contributions will exceed \$5000.

Boston's tremendous offering last night was a fitting climax to Billy Sunday's all-record-smashing campaign in Boston.

The amazing Sunday revival at Philadelphia, two years ago, which stirred the whole country and made Billy Sunday an international figure and probably the greatest evangelist of modern times, has been eclipsed from every angle.

Boston has set up new figures, some of the dreams and ideals of Billy Sunday, and New York has a pace to follow that she may not be able to keep up to.

DR. VAN ALLEN'S WARNING.

The Rev. William H. Van Allen warned the new Christians, those who have professed Christianity as a result of Billy Sunday's campaign in this city—of the perils which face them now that "they will have to go into the ordinary course of Christian life without the aid of excitement." He declared they should recognize and continue a life of prayer and perseverance.

"I praise God that Jesus' had been preached to thousands who have never heard his name open to hear of him before," he continued. "It has been an extraordinary effort. The ordinary work of Christ goes on 365 days in the year, severely, just as it should. But there is great need for extraordinary efforts to shock those in a stupor to the peril they are in."

"I am not here to praise or criticize the Tabernacle campaign. The appeal to the emotion has had a good effect. History is full of important things that were founded in excitement and great emotion. Friends in Syracuse have told me that their city was much better as a result of Sunday's campaign there, and I praise God for that."

"But there is a peril to those who have confessed Christ as their Saviour during this campaign. They should not endeavor to live on past emotions. They should not be content with the foundation they have laid, but continue to build themselves up to their holy faith. The new Christians must go on learning how to use the Bible. There is more danger that they will become scandal mongers than drunkards and God hates the scandal mongers worse."
