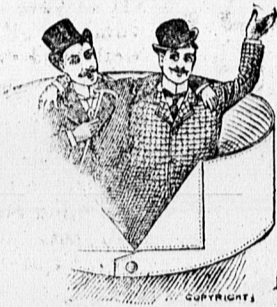

DIRECTORS REPORT OF EXHIBITION ASSOCIATION

Directors are pleased to note a marked improvement especially amongst land horses.
In October last on the request of the leading merchants of Charlottetown and on their financial guarantee our Board held two days horse races. The result shows as will be seen in the Secretary's report that the net profits from these races were ninety-four cents. These races were only held on the request and for the benefit of the merchants of this city, and as a Board we doubted their advisability, but we did not feel like denying assistance to those who always so willingly assisted us. Your Directors are glad to report that, owing to the continued good farm weather throughout the entire exhibition, notwithstanding the large amount expended on permanent repairs, there is, as will be seen in their financial statement a balance of \$12,275.93.
Directors propose paying dividends of 2 1/2 p. c. for the year 1907 (when there was none) and 2 1/2 p. c. for this year to the shareholders leaving the amount in reserve at the last annual meeting intact.
Our Board cannot close their report without recording their high appreciation of the services of their late President the Hon. F. L. Hazard, who on becoming Premier of the province felt himself compelled to resign his Directorship in this Association.
For many years the burden of the work of this Corporation was upon his shoulders, and Exhibitors, shareholders and his Brother Director must all feel they owe him much for his work zealously, efficiently and courteously performed.
John Richards, now the Hon. John Richards was on Mr. Hazard's retirement appointed a Director in his place and Mr. Justice Fitzgerald appointed President.
The Secretary's report is submitted herewith and shows a small credit balance.

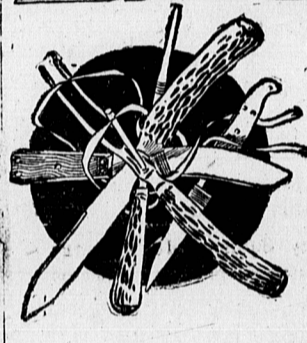
