Some few days ago, Judge McQuarrie of Summerside visited Abram's Village to preside at a court sitting and on this occasion the following appropriate address was read to him. To His Honour Mr. Neil McQuarrie, K. C. Judge of the County Court of Prince County.

Sir: We the residents of the third circuit of the County Court of Prince County desire to welcome you on your first visit to this Court since your elevation to the County Court Bench.

Your high reputation as a lawyer as well as your profound knowledge of the law eminently qualifies you for the honourable position you now occupy, and will inspire confidence in the litigants who may have to appear before you, whilst your long experience in the Court will enable you to accurately weigh evidence and to administer justice accordingly. The lessons to be derived from the great work now being waged in Europe, is the impartiality of his judgments, the strong; and so we feel assured, that before you, the poorest and most humble litigant will receive the same consideration and the same degree of justice as the more wealthy and influential.

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. PATK. McMAHON

There passed peacefully away at the Charlottetown Hospital on July 29th, 1916, another aged resident in the person of Celia Newson, widow of the late Capt. Patrick McMahon, formerly of Rocky Point, P. E. Island, and mother of James McMahon of San Francisco, California in the 83rd year of her age. Her remains were interred in South Shore cemetery beside those of her husband who predeceased her 28 years. May her soul Rest in Peace.

MR. JOHN McISAAC

The death occurred at Wood Islands, on Monday, August 4th, 1916, of Mr. John McIsaac in the 67th year of his age. The deceased was a highly respected resident of the community, a well read, intelligent man, a good obliging neighbor. His grandfather was the first man who settled in Wood Islands nearly a century ago. One cold winter morning the fire went out. Matches had not been invented at that time so he had to go to his nearest neighbor, who lived at Flat River, five miles away for a brand of fire. The funeral took place on Sunday the 6th of August and was very largely attended by Catholics and Protestants, who came from far and near to pay the last tribute of respect to a good man.

JOSEPH JAMIESON

The death occurred in North Sydney last Thursday of Mr. Joseph Jamieson, brother of Mr. R. E. Jamieson, fish merchant of Rustico, P. E. I. His death was due to a relapse following an attack of diphtheria. He leaves a widow and six children. Referring to his death, the North Sydney Herald says: "The deceased gentleman was connected with the Western Union for a period of twenty-six years, and was considered one of the best operators and most upright of employees in the large army of Western Union men operating in this section."

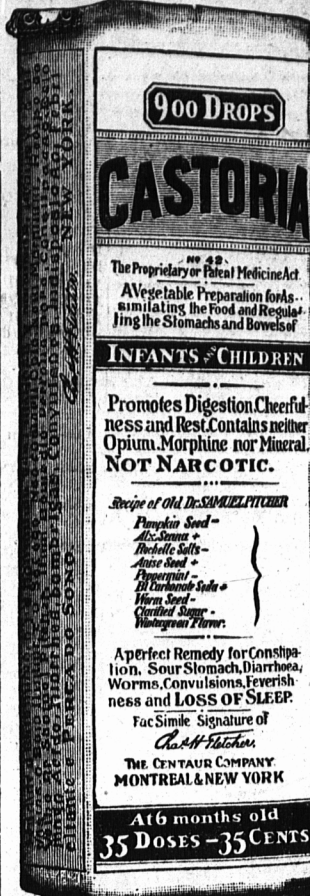
