HISTORICAL WAR BOOK

LONDON, Dec. 1.—This morning's papers give considerable space to a review of "Sir Douglas Haig's Command," a book in two volumes published today on the great war, written by G. A. B. Dewar, who was assisted by Lt. J. H. Boraston, Boraston was private secretary to Haig after the latter became commander-in-chief, and it is pointed out that he had much to do with drafting Haig's famous despatches. The book, which minutely reviews the whole period from December 19, 1915, to November 11, 1918—the period during which Haig was subjected to severe criticism at home—is accepted here as expressing Haig's own views. It contains startling revelations as to Haig's conduct of the war, and Lloyd George's action at critical stages of the great conflict.
