Harry Barr, city, was out for the first time yesterday since his recent illness. Mr. Barr's many friends will be glad to learn of his recovery from a dangerous illness.

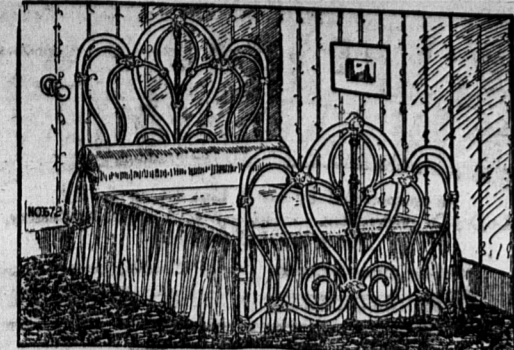
The annual meeting of the P. E. I. P. M. in Prince of Wales College rooms. Election of officers and other important business. A full attendance requested.
