**N. Y. Market Rallies After Sharp Break**

(By Victor Eubank)  
NEW YORK, Aug. 3—(AP)—The stock market during last week suffered its sharpest tail-spin since mid-May but rallied Thursday and displayed a selectively improved tone in the final session. Bonds were narrow.  
Domestic price spiral provided a cautionary argument with U. S. Steel and Bethlehem joining the rate-boosting parade in this industry.  
The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 15 points at 66.9 on the week, widest recession since the period ended May 11. For July, though, the average showed a net advance of 2.6 points on top of a three-point jump in June. The week's turnover of 5,255,500 shares compared with 5,422,980 the week before.  
Late selling Monday gave the list its most severe jolt since June 24 with 1,090,000 shares registering liquidation, and momentum Tuesday with a drop of 13 points in the average, broadest since April 14.  
Offerings tended to dry up Wednesday but declined were well in the majority at the finish with the day's aggregate dealings tapering to 1,170,000 shares.  
Friday's apathetic session, while producing more gains than losses, resulted in but 770,000 shares, a low since June 30. Aiding sentiment was the sale of a stock exchange seat for \$85,000, up \$2,000 equaling the year's high of last Jan. 7.

**Steel Prices Advance But Demand Continues**

CLEVELAND, Aug. 3—(AP)—Despite recent price boosts in the United States steel industry, mills probably will continue to face abnormal demands by purchasers several months this year, the magazine Steel predicted today.  
"Full impact of the higher steel prices on consuming industry will be impossible to assess for a few weeks," the magazine said. "For that matter, the actual extent of the price increase was not possible of determination even late last week for the reason action had not been taken on some products by all producers."  
"With steel consumers facing an estimated increase of \$32,000,000 monthly in their steel bills in the closing five months of this year, expectations of manufacturers of durable and capital goods will probably pass along the higher steel cost to their customers."  
The publication said the industry's general price increase on finished steel products was expected to average about 100 per cent.  
"How long the current level of steel prices will hold is debatable," the magazine said, "but the steel-making rate in the United States held to 4 1/2 high of 66 per cent of capacity last week."

**Creamery Butter Stocks Increasing**  
OTTAWA, Aug. 3—(CP)—Canada's stocks of creamery butter are gradually increasing even though ration books no longer are needed to restrict sales.  
The Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported today that stocks in nine of the principal cities on Aug. 1 totalled 35,571,602 pounds, compared with 35,483,021 on July 1 and 34,565,722 on the corresponding date last year.

**U. S. Gov't Seeks Increase In 1948 Wheat Acreage**  
WASHINGTON, Aug. 1—(AP)—The United States Government today called upon American farmers for another bumper wheat crop next year to help meet overseas shortages until mid-1949.  
It set a wheat planting goal of 75,000,000 acres for wheat to be harvested in 1948. This is 12 per cent greater than the goal for this year and nearly 50 per cent more than average planted in years before the war.
