BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.—The Prince Edward Island Baptist Association which convenes on July 3-6 at Kingsboro promises to be of unusual interest. The first session will be held on Thursday evening of next week when Rev. Arthur Hurn, Tryon, will preach the opening sermon. Rev. C. H. S. McLearn, North River, will preach the Association sermon on Saturday morning at ten o'clock. On Sunday morning Rev. Neil Hermon, Truro N. S. will preach and in the evening Rev. H. T. DeWolfe, D. D.
