Whether Jesus appears the greater as a teacher or as a physician will be decided by the view-point and conscious need of each one. To debate the matter is idle folly. Jesus Christ is in all things supreme.

Moreover, to employ precious time in the study of the various shades of opinion and diameters of difference in thought concerning faith-healing, which are evidence to-day, as a part of this lesson, would be wasteful, wanton and wholly profitless.

The bodies of men belong to God, as well and as fully as their souls, and He has as complete power to heal the diseases of one, and any manner of them, as to save the other from all, and every manner of, unrighteousness. There is nothing too hard for God.

And faith, "which is that attitude of the soul to Jesus which is confident that the saving help of God is present in Him, and that there is no limit to what it can do," will look to Him in every time of need. It will come with boldness to the throne of grace.

catch up a few features of special value. Let not the diverting and delectable merits of Christian Science or of the Emmanuel movement, or of a dozen cults of faith-healing cause you to miss them. Let not psychology deprive you of the discernment which is spiritual. The physical man receives not the things of the Spirit of God."

First. Jesus came, into direct touch and contact with suffering, which others avoided and passed by. "He touched the leper."

Second. Jesus honored the discipline of the church. He finds a place for the formal. He appreciates the need in human affairs of the guiding and regulative powers of social and religious government.

Third. Jesus has an unbounded admiration for faith. The merits of the centurion as a synagogue-builder or philanthropist, or as a benevolent master are not in the reckoning with His appreciation of the quality and character of the centurion's faith.

Fourth. Faith requires no intermediary. It submits to the Lord as absolute. But God may choose to work through the intermediary. He employs second causes. He makes use of the natural. No man, therefore, with commonsense, will overlook or despise them.

Fifth. Faith does not always accompany with privilege. Privilege may blind one to faith. The very opportunities of the church often harden the soul against the high aims for which it stands. What does "Gospel-hardened" mean?

Sixth. The confirming value of the Scriptures. The prophecy of Isaiah (53:4) was not weakened by what Jesus wrought, but what Jesus wrought was illumined by what Isaiah prophesied.

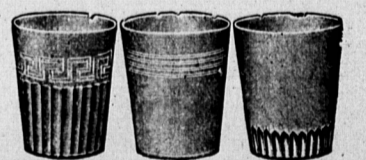

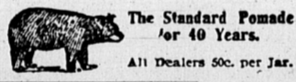
