

TRAM MEN ASK FOR MORE PAY.

HALIFAX, April 15.—The conductors and motormen of the tram service are getting after more pay claiming that in Toronto, Calgary and other places like services command higher wages. The Halifax service now pays them 23 cents per hour and they are asking for a flat rate of 30 cents per hour with thirty-five cents per hour over time and Sunday work, the schedule to go into effect May 10th.

ROBBERY AT HALIFAX.

HALIFAX, April 15.—A passenger from the west whose name is Stinchcomb, booked for the Arabic for Liverpool, was robbed a pocket book containing his ticket by the second-class \$500 in express orders and \$2 in cash. Stinchcomb was waylaid by a couple of colored men who took his property. Yesterday forenoon the pocket book was returned to the White Star office, handed in by a man who found it on the upper slope of the Citadel hill. Evidently the thieves had thrown it away there when they discovered that the express orders were no good without the endorsement. One of the men suspected of the robbery is in the police station.

HORRIBLE DEED OF CRAZED MAN.

FITCHBURG, Mass., April 15.—Ernest Moschner, aged 35, murdered his four children, and then killed himself by shooting at his home on Rollstone street. Continued ill-health made the man temporarily insane the police believe.

Moschner, on returning from work, discovered the bodies of her children and husband with bullet holes in their heads. The murdered children are Elsie, aged 12; Myrtle, aged 11; Norman, aged 8 and Ernest, aged 6.

According to the police the children were playing in the yard when their father called them upstairs to his bedroom. There, the officers believe he lured the children up in front of the bed.

IRISH DOCTORS

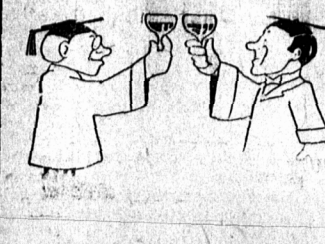
RESIGN IN BODY.

DUBLIN, April 15.—A great sensation has been caused in Ireland by the sudden resignation of all the physicians attached to the Royal National Hospital for consumption in Ireland. The trouble it seems dates back to April, 1911, when the visiting doctors were asked to discuss a proposal to invite an outside medical man to try his special treatment of tuberculosis at the hospital, two wards to be placed at his disposal; but the project was disapproved and was dropped. In May of the same year the medical staff expressed the unanimous opinion that medical treatment was a matter solely for them, and "that, in any case, it was undesirable, in the interest of the hospital, that methods unproved by scientific research should be adopted."

In December last the visiting physicians were informed that the medical man referred to had been appointed as an additional physician. The consulting and visiting staff then resigned, the reasons given that a marked slight had been put upon
