PAGODA CHANGES HUE UNDER AIR POUNDING
LONDON, Aug. 24 (CP) - Before the Japanese ravaged Burma a tiny white pagoda at Mogaung was a mecca for pilgrims. Disregarding its religious significance, the Japanese turned the shrine into a sniper's sanctuary and

direct air support was summoned to remove the stronghold from the path of our advancing army. Two Mustangs dropped 500 pound bombs plump on the target. It was an amazing sight, "one of the pilots said later, "one moment we could see this beautiful white pagoda then came a cloud of smoke, a flash and a terrific crash. The smoke cleared and there stood a bright brick-red temple. The bombs had shattered the outer white crust, leaving the inner shell still giving the familiar pagoda silhouette but with a complete change of color." The story was told by air sources in London.

NOTICE TO FARMERS Regarding Farm

As we have already stated in the press and over the radio. The National Selective Service, Ottawa, in conjunction with the Military Authorities, have made it possible for the Dominion-Provincial Farm Labour Bureau to offer the services of 150 English-speaking members of a Nova Scotia Unit to the farmers of this Province under the Detailed Farm Duty Plan. Under this plan the soldiers work under strict Military Rule; Officers and N. C. O. accompany them to the Province. The rate of pay is \$3.00 per day, wet days and Sundays excluded.

50 of these men have arrived and are now available for farmers who wish to procure their services. And further arrivals of these men will depend upon the number of applications received for their services. Therefore, it is important that farmers wishing to procure this help, now, or at a later date, advise this office immediately the number of men required and the approximate date they will be required. If we do not act quickly these men may be assigned to the other Provinces. To let us know later may be too late.
