

POLICE WOMEN MUST BE HUSKY
 CHICAGO, July 10.—It is the opinion of the prominent local suffragists that a woman policeman—Mayor Harrison has asked that ten of them be appointed—should have the following qualifications:
 She must be "husky."
 She must have nerve.
 She must have had experience in social service.
 She must understand young people.
 She must have common sense.
 She must have ideals.
 The demand for a corps of policewomen created not a little excitement among the many thousands of new women voters yesterday. Suffragists were keen in their discussion of what the uniform of the proposed addition to the police force should be. All agreed she should have a star. The more militant believed she should carry a revolver, but none took kindly to the idea of a policewoman swinging a club. Mrs. Gertrude Howie Britton of the Juvenile Protective League, who was chiefly influential in persuading the mayor that Chicago needs policewomen, asserted that the female officers should not be armed, but "should make their way with women's weapon, the chief of which is common sense."

ENGLAND AND GERMANY READY TO SIGN OPIUM CONVENTION
 WASHINGTON, July 10.—All the twenty-four nations, except Germany and Great Britain, represented by delegates at the opium conference just closed at the Hague, have agreed to deposit ratifications of the convention prohibiting trade in habit-forming drugs. State department advisers say the German and British governments are sympathetic toward the anti-opium movement and probably would ratify the convention if the signatures of Austria, Switzerland and Peru, not represented at the convention force, were assured. Austria is said to be well inclined towards the treaty, but Peru hesitates because of apprehension of injury to her important cocoa trade. The Swiss position is not known here.
 If any important nation finally refuses to join the movement it is the purpose of the others to proceed without them in the adoption of the restrictive measures, relying upon import and export regulations to bring the minority into line.

IN CASES WHERE STRIKES ARE THREATENED THE MEDIATORS, UPON APPLICATION, ARE AUTHORIZED TO TREAT WITH THE PARTIES CONCERNED. IF THE EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES CONSENT TO ARBITRATE, EACH SIDE TO SELECT MEMBERS SO NAMED. THE ERDMAN ACT HAS PROVED EFFICACIOUS IN MANY CASES IN THE PAST, BUT THERE APPEARS NOW TO BE A DEMAND THAT A LARGER BOARD, MORE DIRECTLY UNDER GOVERNMENT AUSPICES, SHALL ACT IN THE FUTURE.

TITANIC SUIT ENTERED FOR TRIAL IN COURTS IN BOSTON
 BOSTON, July 10.—The first suit brought in the Massachusetts courts for loss of life on the steamer Titanic, was entered in the superior court yesterday by counsel for M. S. Mari Wiseman, of Montreal, who for the benefit of herself and her six children seeks to recover \$50,000 from the Oceanic Steam Navigation Company, Limited, for the loss of the life of Phillip Wiseman, her husband. The plaintiff sets forth that under the English statute, known as Lord Campbell's act, she is entitled to prosecute her suit in this state. The complainant alleges that, besides being insufficiently equipped with life-saving apparatus, the vessel was being pushed for a speed record in the face of warnings against icebergs.
