DEATH OF MICHAEL H. MACCABE

The death occurred on Friday last at his home in Bedouque of Michael H. MacCabe, a well known farmer. Mr. MacCabe was 91 years of age and was a native of Bedouque. Although well advanced in years he was active until a few weeks before his death. He was a man of very fine characteristics and had one of the largest farms in the district. He was a staunch supporter of the Conservative party and some years ago ran an election in the Fourth District of Prince County for the local House but was defeated. He was always interested in politics and was always to the fore in every political movement. He was a member of the Catholic Church at Kinkora and was held in the highest esteem by all who knew him. He was twice married, his widow, formerly a Miss Mullins of Kensington, survives, and the following sons: Fred at Bedouque; Rev. George MacCabe, formerly of Sturgeon, now home on Jack Lake; Cecil on the homestead, and two daughters, Margaret and Edna at home; also one sister, Mrs. Wm. Deighan of Cape Traverse, to whom sympathy is extended.

The funeral took place on Friday morning from his late residence at the Roman Catholic Church at Kinkora. Attending the funeral were Rev. Martin Monaghan, D. D., of Miscouche; Rev. Bennett McDonald of Summerside, and Rev. Reginald MacDonald of Indian River. S.
