CABLE COMMUNICATION IS INTERRUPTED.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11—Undersea disturbances, possibly earthquake, are believed to be responsible for the interruption of cable communication with the West Indies, although a message from Kingston, J. A., got through by a circuitous route, reporting disastrous wind storms and floods on the Island.

The Commercial Cable Company say such a storm would not likely affect the lines of the cable.

LAST OF THE LUCANIA.

HALIFAX, Nov. 10. — The Cunard Line steamer Lucania, which has been in the transatlantic service for seventeen years, sailed on her last voyage from Liverpool, Oct. 30. Her port is Swanssea, where she will be broken up. The steamer was badly damaged by a fire that broke out on board of her when she was lying at Liverpool on August 14, last. Recently she was sold to a firm of ship brokers for \$150,000. The Lucania was built at Glasgow in 1892. She was 601 feet in length and had a net tonnage of 4,975.
