Scout News and Notices

The architect's plans for the fine new Knox Presbyterian Church, Ottawa, includes a Boy Scout Troop room.

Kipling's "Jungle Books" provides the psychology and much of the programme of the Wolf Cubs, the junior Boy Scouts.

The French Government has decorated M. Andre Lefevre of the Scouts of France with the insignia of Chevalier of the Legion of Honour.

British Boy Scouts are assisting in the "Buy British Goods" campaign, one of England's efforts to restore the balance of exports and imports.

The next world gathering of Boy Scouts, in Hungary, in 1933, will be held at Godollo, the former estate of Emperor Francis Joseph I. The park was placed at the service of the Scouts by Admiral Horthy, the Regent of Hungary.

Records at Ottawa headquarters show that 50,880 Boy Scouts have taken first aid training, and that 15,631 have qualified for the advanced first aid "Ambulance Man" badge. For a number of boys the training has proven the first step to medicine.

The Boy Scout statues appear over a corner window of the new Confederation Block, Ottawa. They commemorate public service rendered by Scouts, including location and decoration of the graves of the Fathers of Confederation, for the Diamond Jubilee of 1927.

When unable to capture a horse that had been on range all summer a farmer applied at Boy Scout district headquarters, Ottawa, for a Scout roping expert. The boy was taken out to the farm, and promptly lassoed the horse. The farmer had seen an exhibition of Scout lariat work at the Ottawa fair.

Arrangements are being made for an attendance of 25,000 Boy Scouts from some 45 countries at the next World Scout Jamboree, to be held in Hungary in 1933.

Probably the prize long-distance swap for Canadian boys was that of Fort William Boy Scouts—a big wolf skin for the skin of a kangaroo. The swap was made with the 1st Granville Scout Troop of Australia.

On Dec. 1st a coast-to-coast chain of some 75 toy repair shops were in operation, preparing to assist Old Saint Nick in his big Christmas eve tour of joy-giving. The shops are manned by Boy Scouts and Girl Guides. By the middle of the month the number of shops will be doubled.

As many as 800 letters have been received at Dominion Boy Scout headquarters from western settlers to whom Welcome-to-Canada toys were sent at Christmas by Scout toy shops. It is expected this Christmas that some 5,000 settlers' kiddies will be visited by the Boy Scout and Girl Guide Claus Junior.

That his Scout training will be useful in his missionary work among the nomadic Tauregs of the southern Sahara Desert was the expectation of Rover Scout Firmin Sauve, formerly of the 6th Ottawa Troop, when he left Ottawa in November. He was presented with an Old Scout's pin as a good luck talisman.

While Scout first aid training does not have in mind dog patients, it works just as well. When a Winnipeg Scout's collie was run over by a truck and a leg broken his young owner improvised splints, used a handkerchief and a tie for bandages, and carried the dog to a veterinary, where the leg was amputated in a case.

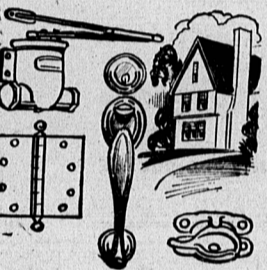
