MISS CARRIE McEACHERN whose marriage is recorded in another column has been a resident of Summerside for a number of years and was employed in the tailoring establishment of Mr. W. A. Stewart. She was popular among her many friends who will wish her a happy wedded life. The groom, Mr. Alexander Campbell, was formerly a resident of this town, having been for several years in the employ of Mr. John McKay, harness maker, and a well and favorably known citizen. Congratulations.

MR. S. H. JONES made his last shipment of 360 lambs from here Saturday, making a total of 11,035 sheep and lambs since Oct. 13th. He makes his last shipment of geese tomorrow which will complete a total of 6,000 geese. He has during this season paid to farmers for stock, about \$30,000, about \$700, to the P. E. I. R. R. and nearly \$1900.00 to the Steam Navigation Co. This is the largest season's business done by Mr. Jones on the Island since he first came here, which is about the best testimony he can have for straight and honest dealing. He leaves for his home in Sabrevois, Que., tomorrow. His many friends throughout the island will be glad to know that he purposes returning next season to continue the good work.

THE three masted schooner Edna 310 tons, Capt. Walter Donovan cleared Saturday for Demerara with the following cargo. Shipped by Messrs. A. C. Rogers & Co.:—2100 sacks white oats, 1000 bbls potatoes, 30 crates vegetables, 10 cases butter, 15 boxes cheese, 5 cases lobsters, 30 horses (said to be the best looking lot taking together ever shipped from Summerside.) 3 milch cows, 4 Holstein bulls, 70 sheep, 30 pigs, 275 turkeys, 275 geese, 250 ducks, 100 hens; besides a lot of feed and other sundries. The cargo is valued at \$9,000. Capt. W. H. Barnard, one of the partners, goes in the ship to look after the firm's interests. His many friends wish him a pleasant and profitable voyage.

BARRELS OF BEER.

Last year the production of beer in the United Kingdom was 35,000,000 barrels, and the taxation upon it was nearly £12,000,000—a million and a half more than in the preceding year; so the Chancellor of the Exchequer told the Country Brewers' Association at the Hotel Metropole in London, one day this month. The consumption works out, he calculated, at thirty-five gallons for every person of the population. He hinted that "the trade" is so evidently prosperous that beer could bear some more taxation.

London's county council has decided to assume control of the water supply of the metropolitan district, and will try to get a bill through Parliament to enable it to purchase "by agreement or by compulsion" the property of the eight companies that now provide the water.

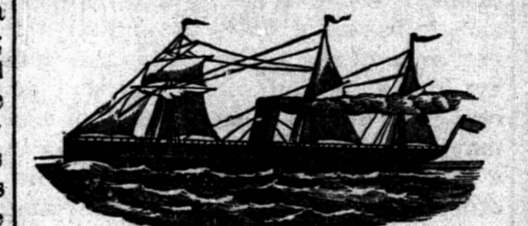
