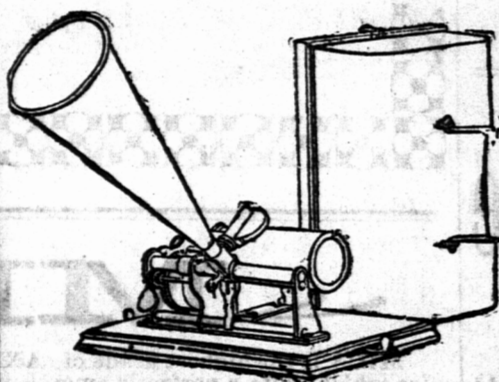

THE Hants Journal says:—Notwithstanding the adverse reports concerning the Crowell fortune some of the heirs who reside here have not given up all hopes of receiving a handsome addition to their incomes before many months pass away. A large gathering of the Crowell heirs took place at Lower Onslow recently, when the representative who had been to England gave a report of what he had done, and those present were hopeful that the fortune is not yet beyond their reach.

It is a great credit to Prince Edward Island that so many of her sons should be chosen to represent large colleges in their intercollegiate debates, especially is it to her credit when the colleges represented are central seats of learning, where are congregated students from many and various states and provinces. Mr. McLeod will, no doubt, acquit himself in this task with honor to himself, his native province, and the college he has the honor to represent. Other Islanders too, have within the writers memory, in the past few years, ably represented colleges in the debate. Mr. W. Everett McNeill, of Lower Montague, won the highest encomiums for his masterly speeches while representing Acadia college against Dalhousie. Mr. McNeill is a singularly gifted and eloquent debater. His language is easy and flowing, and his manner of speaking is logical and convincing. Messrs. E. Simpson, of Belmont, and Geo. Irving, of Vernon River Bridge, were also chosen to represent their respective colleges. Both of these young men are able and skilled debaters.

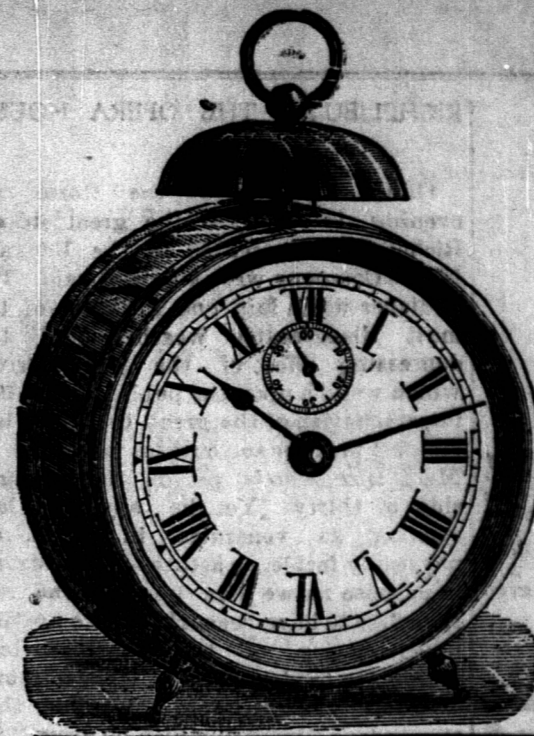

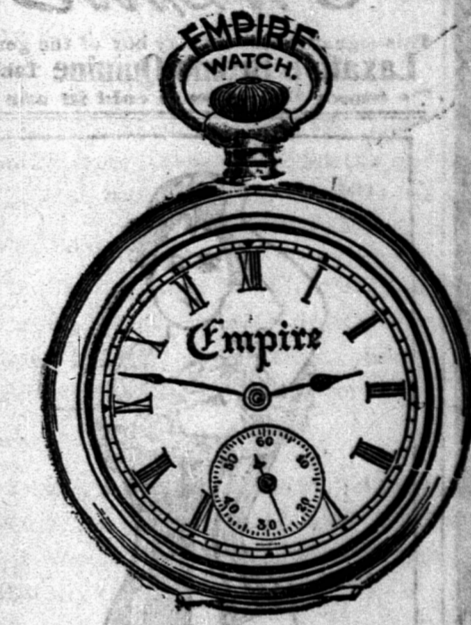
