On Sunday morning in Tryon Methodist Church after an exceedingly earnest and practical sermon by the pastor, Rev. G. F. Dawson, Miss Starr of Halifax sang most acceptably "A Song of Trust."

Rev. Sala and Mata, the reverend gentlemen, who are collecting money for Protestant missions in Turkey went to Summerside yesterday morning. They have met with considerable success in the city.

Samuel Kinley, and wife, who left Cape Wolfe, Lot 7, nineteen years ago for Dakota, made a visit here of two months this summer, and left on return to Dakota on Saturday last. Mr. Kinley was formerly a shipbuilder at Cape Wolfe.

A number of special prizes are offered at the Nova Scotia Provincial Exhibition in addition to those announced in the prize list. The Canadian Holstein-Friesian Association offer \$25 for the three pure bred cows of any number making the most estimated butter in two days judged by the babcock test. The three cows must be owned by the one exhibitor. This prize offering is in addition to the amount offered in the prize list for Dairy tests.

The Maritime Homestead says: "We are glad to learn from a very reliable source that the Prince Edward Island pork industry is in a flourishing condition, the number of hogs raised in that province having been doubled within the last three years, and that the business of the Charlottetown packing factory, which is only part of the industry in that province, amounts to half a million dollars a year. We are also advised that prospects were never better for Island farmers, who are well pleased, and particularly so with the prices obtained for their hogs the last two years."

The High Court I. O. Foresters will meet in annual session at Tignish, Thursday August 7th, at 3 p. m. Reduced rates over the P. E. Island Railway have been secured, for all persons whether members of the Order or not, by the regular trains east of Charlottetown and Cape Traverse branch. The morning train from Souris and Georgetown will connect with the special train Charlottetown at Royalty Junction, on the morning of the 7th. The special leaves Charlottetown ten minutes before the regular leaves but the regular passes the special at Royalty Junction. Foresters and others going to Tignish must go by special. A stop of 40 minutes is made at Coleman where the Brothers of Court Great West will provide dinner; the price of tickets for the same are 35 cents each, and will be sold on the train by persons appointed for that purpose. Great preparations are being made by the members of Court Tignish for the reception of the High Court, and ample accommodation for all who will attend. It is as certain as can be, that the meeting will be honored with the presence of the distinguished Supreme Chief Ranger, Dr. Oronbyatekha.

The July number of The Maine Central, a publication in the interests of the Maine Central Railroad Company, contains a very graphic and well written article entitled "From the White Mountains to Canada." After describing the different routes by which the cities, Montreal and Quebec may be reached, the writer reviews the points of interest in those places, street-car systems, trade, etc. Other places of interest to the tourist and sportsman, reviewed are, Lake St. John and Saguenay, Somerset County, Belgrade Lakes, etc. The article is profusely illustrated with photos of Montreal from different points, Notre Dame Church, Montreal, Place Vigier Hotel and Station, Montreal, views from Lake St. John, Chateau Frontenac, and Quebec.
