Naval Expenditure Ruining France Under the Pretext of Defending Her Says Baron de Constant.

PARIS, April 14.—Baron De-tournelles de Constant in his speech to the Senate yesterday maintained that naval expenses were ruining France under the pretext of defending her.

The speaker, cited remarks made by leading statesmen of Great Britain, Russia and Germany, favoring an European accord for the limitation of naval expenses and urged that this would benefit the entire world, particularly Russia, Japan and the United States, leaving them free to develop their commercial resources.

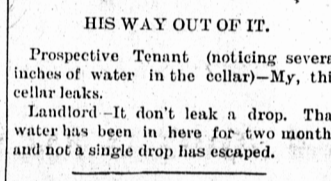
