BULLETINS FROM BIRDLAND



Fifty years ago cows grazed inside the five-acre meadow enclosed by an old snake fence; but when Farmer Smith died and the land was sold the new owner, not interested in cattle, allowed Nature to have her way. The first summer little change was apparent, except that grass grew long and leaves sprouted low down on the trunks of the two big elm trees. As before, Song Sparrows perched on the fence and bobolinks of Bobolinks filled the air.

By the following June low bushes had started up here and there, attracting Nashville and Chestnut-sided Warblers. The fifth year, small evergreens, birch, and poplars brought Slate-colored Junco, White-throated and Chipping Sparrows. As trees grew taller and thicker Bobolinks were replaced by Redstarts, Hermit Thrushes, and Red-eyed Vireos. A pair of Goldfinches chose a maple sapling for their home, and Rose-breasted Grosbeaks built a frail nest in an alder.

Now that the giant elms have fallen and some of the fifty year old trees have been reduced to stumps or logs, the Grosbeaks have left. Wood Peckers, Nuthatches, and Hooded Warblers are beginning to arrive. Before many years even Chickadees will give place to Canada Jays, Black-throated Green Warblers, Golden-crowned Kinglets, Hairy and Downy Woodpeckers.

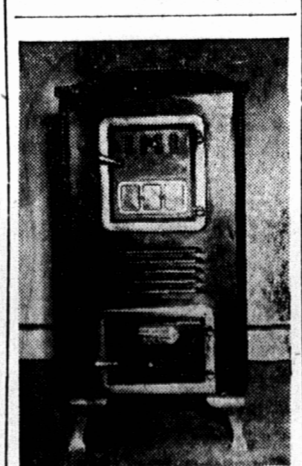

OTTAWA, Dec. 7-(CP)- The job of the Canadian Government Travel Bureau is to get people to visit Canada. It's up to the Province to entice them to any particular part of the country. This was Reconstruction Minister Winter's reply to suggestions today that the Bureau do more to publicize the smaller resort districts.

Labor Gov't Gives Advice To Housewives

LONDON, Dec. 7-(AP)-The Labor Government today began distributing 1,000,000 copies of a leaflet entitled "For Women Only" - an appeal for housewives to fight inflation. It tells them how. The leaflet admits frankly that cheapening of the pound from \$4.83 to \$2.80 (U.S.) is going to increase the cost of living. "Prices are going up - not by a lot, certainly, but enough to make housekeeping a bigger headache than ever," it says. But it warns that any rush to buy scarce goods will aggravate the problem. "It's patriotic as well as good housekeeping to refuse to buy anything that is dearer than it should be," it said. The leaflet was issued by the Economic Information unit of the Treasury.

C.W.L. Convention At Halifax In 1950

SAINT JOHN, N.B., Dec. 8 - (CP) - The 1960 national convention of the Catholic Women's League will be held at Halifax, Mrs. W.C. Fewings, national publicity convener, announced tonight. Mrs. Fewings was notified by Mrs. T.E. Durocher, Windsor, Ont., the national president, that an invitation of the Halifax archdiocese to hold the meeting there had been accepted. It will be the first national C.W.L. convention at Halifax in 26 years.
