THE BASEBALL CHAMPS DIVIDE SUM OF \$35,000

The Splendid Winnings of the Champions of America - Said to be the Best Baseball Team that Ever Covered A Diamond

CHICAGO, Oct. 15.-Manager Frank Chance of the National League baseball club, the winners of the world's championship, is at present the popular idol of Chicago.

"We have won the world's championship honestly and fairly," he said. "For our opponents, I want to say that things broke rather badly for them. Nevertheless, I believe that I have gathered together the best baseball team that ever covered a field. I cannot hand them too much praise. I have been sharp and severe with them sometimes, but it has always been during games. They do not have to be watched otherwise."

There is not a player on the Chicago team who would not go to the limit for Chance. They realize that he is a player as well as a manager. He will not ask a player to do a thing he would not do himself. He takes pot-luck with his men. Their joys and sorrows have been his. Their triumphs have been his chief aim. He is a natural horn baseball leader. He showed his grit in Friday's game when a shout from "Will Bill" Donovan broke the middle finger of his right hand. He went back to the players' bench, had it bandaged and resumed his position at first base, as though a broken finger were of no consequence.

JAPS RESTRICT EMIGRATION TO HAWAII ISLANDS

Six of the Colonization Companies Quit - Will Attempt to Turn Exodus to Populate Korean Waste Lands Will Help Lemieux's Mission.

MONTRÉAL, Oct. 15.-The Star's London authorities here point to the Tokio government's action in restricting Japanese emigration organizations as evidence of Japan's readiness to meet reasonable Canadian objections. It is announced that by the enforcement of a \$25,000 deposit the Japanese government has already brought about the dissolution of six more irresponsible companies who have been thriving on Japanese emigration to Hawaii and a number of others are expected to collapse under the stricter government relations by the newly elected colonial bureau of the foreign office at Tokio, which is specially charged to supervise emigration.

SWEDEN RED-HOT TO CHALLENGE FOR AMERICA'S CUP

Contributions Pouring in to Build a Boat; Captain and Mates Will Work Without Pay.

STOCKHOLM, Oct. 15.-Wm. Olson Coösta Kyhlberger, who are at the head of the movement here to build a challenger for the America cup, say that a large portion of the money required to construct and sail a 90-footer, estimated at about \$189,000, has already been subscribed.

Many large manufacturers have offered to furnish material gratis, the captain and the three mates of the yacht will sail without pay, the designer will accept no compensation for his work and the builders only will charge the net cost of the construction. Messrs. Olsen and Kyhlberger think they will now be able to guarantee funds even for a 95-footer, if required.
