To Sergeant Peter McInnis and Lance Corporal Ambrose Doyle: Gentlemen:—We, your neighbours and friends have met here this evening to extend you a warm and hearty welcome on your return home from France.

It is with great pleasure and pride we recall the fact that, in 1915 when Prince Edward Island called for a battalion of the loyal sons to go to the support of their fellow Canadians who were fighting, bleeding and dying on the battlefields of France in defence of the cause of Freedom and Humanity, that you and several other Earncliffe boys promptly responded to that call and volunteered for service abroad.

On the eve of your final departure from Earncliffe, in the address we presented you on that occasion, we expressed this sentiment: "Knowing you boys as well as we do, we know and feel sure that when your hour of trial comes, you will be just as brave, just as heroic, and do just as gallant deeds as were done by those brave Canadians who have already won their dying fame for Canada by their heroic deeds on the field of battle."

A few months later your hour of trial came, and then by your undaunted courage and bravery, "mid scenes of danger and death on the blood battlefields of France you, and your Earncliffe comrades amply justified that faith we had so implicitly placed in you, and today, Earncliffe is proud of her gallant soldier boys who so nobly responded to the call of duty in the Empire's hour of trial and danger; proud to know that they were part of that great Canadian army that contributed so largely towards winning the greatest victory for Freedom, Truth and Justice ever won in the history of the world.

In conclusion we ask you to accept the accompanying purse as a feeble expression of our appreciation of your services, and our best wishes for a Bright and Happy New Year.

After the presentation the boys heartily thanked their friends for their kind words of appreciation, and their gift. They were then "bounced" by some of their muscular admirers, after which dancing was resumed and a most enjoyable evening spent by everyone.—Q
