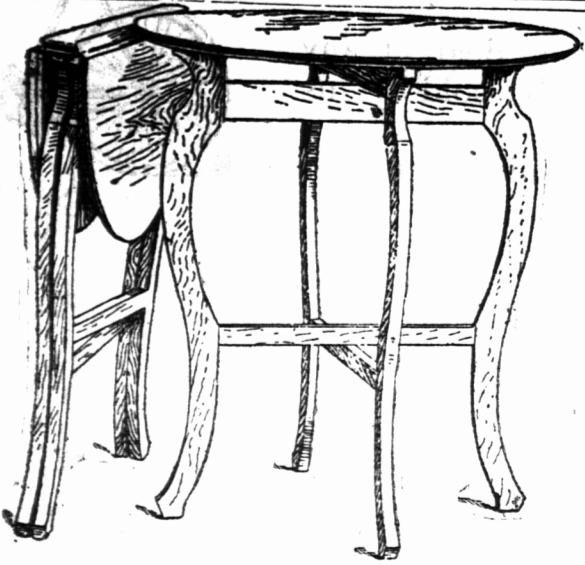

**THE STANLEY.**

A Quebec despatch of the St. John Globe, states that it is in contemplation, when the new winter steamer now under construction is ready, to take the Stanley to the St. Lawrence and make a railway ferry steamer of her at Levis. We do not apprehend that there is any sufficient authority for this rumor, but lest there may be something in it we hasten to file a caveat in due time.

These are the days of new and increased interest in winter navigation. Russia, Denmark, Sweden and other northern European nations are giving increased attention to "ice-breakers" and winter steamers. On this side the Atlantic we are making an effort to navigate the Gulf of St. Lawrence in winter to and from Paspébiac. Quebec is becoming increasingly anxious to have her port opened earlier in the spring and kept open later in the beginning of winter. The possibility of navigating the St. Lawrence in the winter as far up as Montreal is being speculated upon. And the French speaking province in these days is in a position to command favors of a ministry which it so strongly supports.

It ought therefore to be distinctly set down at this time that the Stanley was built especially for the trade between Prince Edward Island and the mainland—built to fulfil as far as might be the compact to keep up "daily" steam communication with the mainland, according to the stipulations of the union agreement. The Stanley has done good service, but she has by no means been able to make the daily trip. We have had long interruptions, running from days to weeks at a time. Hence came the demand for a "second winter steamer."

It was not so much a new steamer as two steamers that was demanded, and demanded as a right. Sir Louis Davis, as our able and influential representative, responded to the demand, first by placing the Petrel on the Capes route, and when that experiment proved a failure, he was able to secure an order for the construction of the second winter steamer, a proper ice-breaker, to go on one or other route between the Island and the mainland, to improve the incomplete and insufficient service rendered by the Stanley.

To give us a new steamer and take away the Stanley would be to disappoint the hopes of the people, and to refuse them their rights. It would be to openly violate the union compact, as to daily steam communication. For a quarter of a century past that compact has not been kept. The excuse has been that it was not

possible to keep up daily steam communication. It is clear that two steamers could do much more than one to effect that purpose.

Both the Stanley and the new steamer were designed for the better fulfilment of the agreement referred to. The two can give us at best but a partial fulfilment of this solemn and binding compact. We are not therefore disposed to submit to have the Stanley taken away when the new winter steamer is put on. If Quebec, or the Intercolonial want ice-breakers, or winter ferries, and a case can be made out to warrant the expenditure let them have them built to order. But in the name of right, reason and justice we insist on keeping the two steamers demanded by the people of P. E. Island, promised to them, built for them and required to fulfil the terms of union.

As yet there is no completed railway line across South America from ocean to ocean, though many hooks and maps show the Trans-Andean Railway extending entirely across through Argentine and Chili. On the Chilian side the railway extends to the foot of the mountains, but there remains a gap of about forty-four miles yet to be completed. This unfinished section includes a difficult piece of tunnelling under the Cumbre Pass, which is 12,795 feet above sea level.

On being refused by Collector Currie access to the Orders in Council relating to bonded warehouses the Editor of THE GUARDIAN immediately wired the Minister of Customs that the Collector had refused the information, and asked that copies of the regulations referred to be sent. They were immediately forwarded and we are in receipt of a bound volume containing them. The Minister of Customs has shown in this instance that courteous and obliging disposition which is so conspicuously lacking in his Charlottetown subordinate. The next time we apply to Mr. Currie for information we shall probably get it promptly. We shall see.
