**DARK-TONED DYES BRING PALE SHEERS UP TO DATE**

New dark shades of hosiery which achieve a fashionable liaison between "new look" hemlines and shoes will be on parade during the holidays.

Want to put your legs into this show? You can with no strain on your budget. If you'll round up those pale nylons that look dated and douse them in dark dyes. Thanks to new dark-toned stocking dyes, this trick of bringing pale socks up to date need only set you back a few pennies, cost little of your time.

Another point in favour of this simple and thrifty stocking renovation is that broken-up pairs can be dyed and put back into service with matching mates.

The procedure? First wash stockings and rinse thoroughly. Then dissolve dye in warm water in an agate or porcelain pan set on your stove. Heat the solution to just below a simmer. Drop in wet unfolded stockings. To distribute dye evenly, move stockings around in the dye bath—which is kept just below the simmering point—for 15 minutes. Rinse stockings in cool water to float out excess dye and hang your glamorous dark-toned sheers up to dry.

**McGILL TO STAGE WINTER CARNIVAL**

MONTREAL, Dec 19 — (CP) — McGill University, playing host next February to the intercollegiate ski championships, is planning a mammoth winter carnival that will have its locale both in Montreal and the Laurentian mountains. McGill's first winter carnival will be staged Feb. 19 to 21 and a busy program has been prepared

for the Canadian and United States teams that will compete. Skating, tobogganing and sleighing on the slopes of Mount Royal will set the proceedings in motion Feb. 19, with large bonfires providing light and the McGill band supplying music. Competitors will move to St. Margaret's in the Laurentians, Feb. 20, for the downhill and slalom races, with skiers from a dozen universities expected to compete. Some of the carnival will shift to Montreal at night and while spectators, supplied with hot suppers, sit in straw-floored stands at Molson Stadium, speed-skating races will be held between Canadian and American competitors. There will be figure skating performances as well and a carnival queen will be crowned. Bands and bonfires again will lend color to the festival and when the outdoor program is completed, basketball, wrestling, boxing and squash events will be staged in the McGill gymnasium, to be followed by a dance. The cross-country and ski jumping events of the college championships will be staged Feb. 21 and after the jumping the McGill hockey team will play an American team. Another dance at night will bring the carnival to a close.
