

INDIANS IN WEST DO THE TURKEY TROT

RENO, Nev., July 11 (Special)—Lo, the poor Indian, to whom the poet once referred as a person of untutored mind, has not only brought his mind around to the civilized way of thinking, but has tutored his feet in the intricate abandon of the "hug" and the "trot." Where his ancestors, chanting weird tribal songs and beating drums, once stamped around snakes, idols and the graves of Indians who had gone to the happy hunting ground, the Indian of today lets a hand furnish the music while he waits with a terpsichorean impatience for the Robert B. Lee.

At Lee—appropriate place—in Yko county, Nevada, more than a thousand Shoshone Indians congregated for evidence of the fact that while Indian music is good enough in its ways the men of another race write music better adapted to the expression of "primal man." In short, they are turkey trotting, buny hugging and trying to tango, with a little bit more enthusiasm than Indians ever displayed over anything but "fire water" or a scalping party.

In justice to the old Indians, it must be said that they do not trot. They are sticking to the old chants and dances, and they view the capers

of the younger generation with that same dismal, "make-me-laugh" look which was the fashion of another day.

The young folk do the trots on platforms, with modern musical instruments and Broadway "successes" furnishing the necessary stimulus.

The Indians came from all parts of Nevada to attend the encampment and some of them walked as far as two hundred miles in order to get there. The fete is in celebration of the fact that, game is abundant and fishing good. Save for the intrusion of the trot music the old tribal rites govern the celebration.

NEW YORK, July 10 (Special)—More than twelve hundred persons, mostly women and children of the Church of the Ascension, in Kent Street, Greenpoint, were imperilled on board the excursion barge Starina when the tug William McAlister, which was towing the barge through the entrance to Hell Gate, off Blackwell's Island, lost control of the barge, causing it to whirl about in the eddying currents of the treacherous waters. An hour and a half later at the entrance to Hell Gate the Starina spun about by cross currents, broke completely from the control of the tug, and was swept in the direction of a government dredge anchored off the Astoria shore. Another tug lying off Astoria went to the aid of the barge, and towed it safely to a pier on the Astoria side of the river. When the passengers had been quieted the trip to the grove was made without further incident.

After he had carried out a raid on a gambling club, General Ernesto Asbert, governor of Havana province, Senator Vidal Morales and Representative Arias were arrested and are awaiting trial in connection with the crime.

ENGLISH CITIES TO HAVE AIRSHIP SERVICE.

LONDON, July 9.—The recent announcement that the establishment of a passenger airship service in England, was in contemplation, is now followed by a statement that a company is being formed with a capital of \$1,250,000, for the purpose of running airships on commercial lines from London to Brighton, Manchester, Birmingham and other places, as well as to Paris. The ships will be so constructed that they can be armed for war service if this should be desired.

DEAN OF SACRED COLLEGE IS 85

ROME, July 9.—Cardinal Oreglia di Santo Stefano, the Dean of the Sacred College, reached his eighty-fifth birthday anniversary to-day. He is the oldest of the living Cardinals, as regards appointment, having been nominated to the Sacred College by the late Pius IX., and being now the only surviving Cardinal created under that Pontificate. Cardinal Oreglia was born in the diocese of Mondovi, July 9, 1828, and as a student at the Academy of Rome gained prominence in theology and languages. He became a Jesuit novice, but did not continue in the Society of Jesus and was ordained to the secular priesthood in 1856.

CHRISTIAN ENDEAVORS MEET

LOS ANGELES, Cal., July 9.—Los Angeles to-day is a sea of crimson and white. Flags, festoons, streamers and banners decorate in profusion public and private buildings, business blocks and residences. Crimson and white are the colors of the Christian Endeavor Union, and the citizens of Los Angeles take this method of expressing their welcome to the twenty-sixth international Christian Endeavor convention.

The notable guest of the week is Rev. Dr. Francis E. Clark, "father of Christian Endeavor," who with Mrs. Clark will take a prominent part in the sessions of the coming six days.

TRIBUTE TO DEAD

NEW YORK, July 9.—A London cable says—At the moment when Alfred Lyttleton, M. P., was buried yesterday at Worcester, the Oxford-Cambridge Varsity cricket match was stopped at Lords. Every head was bared, flags were half-masted and the crowd stood in a silent testimonial to the great player of other years. A similar tribute was paid at the Warwick-Kent match at Birmingham.

1,200 ADRIFT IN HELL GATE

It was feared the Mount Tamalpais tavern, on the summit of the mountain, was doomed, and Mill Valley, Larkspur and Corte Madero were in grave danger.

Mount Tamalpais is 2,606 feet high.

WEALTHY WOMAN RISKS HER LIFE

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., July 10 (Special)—At the risk of their lives, Mrs. B. Dobson Altemus and Mrs. Arthur Spencer, a wealthy carpet manufacturer, both widely known horsewomen, dashed into a three story stone building, occupied by the gardener on the Dobson estate at Abbottsford this afternoon when fire swept the third floor and assisted in carrying out household goods.

Other buildings as well as the mansion, known as "Bella Vista," on the Dobson estate were threatened by the flames.

The fire was discovered by the little

son of Mrs. Altemus. He ran and notified the gardener and also his mother. Mrs. Altemus telephoned to the Fire Department and to the fire corps in the Dobson carpet mill.

While the fire brigade was hurrying over Mrs. Altemus and Mrs. Spencer hurried to the burning house, where they were met by the wives of the chauffeur and the gardener, who were hysterical. Mrs. Altemus groped her way to the third floor, collected the more valuable articles in the room and dropped them, piece by piece, to Mrs. Spencer, who was at the window on the second floor. They were taken from the house. The loss will not exceed \$500.

REUNION OF VETERANS.

LONDON, O., July 10—What will in all probability be the last reunion they will ever hold was begun here today by a handful of veterans of the Mexican war. The old soldiers, who look upon the veterans at the recent Gettysburg reunion as mere youngsters, plan to spend several days here in renewing acquaintances and swapping yarns of the stirring days when they followed Winfield Scott and "Zach" Taylor in the campaign below the Rio Grande. The leading spirit of the reunion is Captain J. D. Fisher, of Chillicothe, O., who is president of the National Association of Mexican War Veterans. Captain Fisher is 87 years old and almost blind.

U. S. TARIFF BILL DEBATE NEXT WEEK

WASHINGTON, July 9.—The Senate finance sub-committee continued to-day checking up to the schedules of the tariff bill. Chairman Simmons hoped to have it ready for the printer to-night, and to call a meeting of the entire committee to-morrow. If possible the bill will be reported to the Senate late Thursday. The debate, however, will probably not begin until next week.
