EMPIRE DAY—ARBOR DAY.

The two ideas blend beautifully. The British Empire is the greatest state, the most populous, and with the widest control on sea and land that ever existed on earth. It has at its heart one of the wisest and best of Sovereigns, who has rendered worldwide and enduring services to the cause of peace. Everywhere throughout the vast expanse of the Empire there is loyalty to and affection for our King, and pride in the great imperial fabric of which we form a part. And in no other portion of the Empire does this love, loyalty and national pride glow more brightly than in this fair Province, "set in the silver sea."

Thus Empire Day appeals to us all, old and young. Arbor Day should also appeal to us. Long ago those who sought a hereditary device for Prince Edward Island set forth its relations to the Mother Kingdom, found it in a young and growing tree, sheltered beneath a stalwart British oak. Trees are among the most beautiful objects in nature. Every young tree planted today typifies this fair Island Province, helps to beautify it and to further endear it to all who dwell in the land. So let us plant our trees with a thought of home, plant a maple with a thought of Canada, an oak with a thought of Imperial Britain.

The oak of which the "wooden walls" of England were framed and the hearts of oak that manned them; the maple with its winged seed, its sturdy trunk, a richer life-blood than its fellows and its regal splendor of autumnal glory, how naturally the thoughts that cluster about them, suggestive of national beauty and imperial grandeur, lent the emblematic services of Empire Day and Arbor Day together, which we are about to celebrate.

"ALL RAIL CONNECTION."

There is a vigorous agitation on Vancouver Island including the city of Victoria, for an all-rail connection with the Mainland of Canada. There are both parallels and contrasts between the case of Vancouver and Prince Edward Island. Vancouver is several times larger than our island, but with fewer people. It is by no means as fertile as our Province, but it has valuable and extensive coal mines and its chief city, Victoria has twice the population of Charlottetown. Victoria has efficient and continuous communication by steam navigation with the mainland and the railway system of Canada, summer and winter, and what is of almost equal advantage for a through freight rate from eastern points which are the same as those of Vancouver on the Mainland.

To make our position relatively equal with the city of Victoria we should have the same freight rates to and from all western points in Canada as Pictou has, or Point du Chene. What would we not give for that? Navigation is not obstructed by ice in the Straits of Georgia which separate Vancouver Island from the Mainland. The steamers come and go every day in the year. What would we not give for a like privilege? But Vancouver Island and Victoria are not satisfied with these great privileges. They are clamoring for "all-rail connection," and they will get it. The Straits of Georgia, unlike our Straits, are full of islands. It is possible to bridge the Straits of Georgia, although the work will be difficult, circuitous and costly—quite as costly as the construction of our Tunnel. But this does not daunt the Victorians. They have faith and courage. We may get pointers from them. The Victoria Colonist ably champions

the all-rail movement. It quotes a recent letter from Sir Wilfrid Laurier in which he says, "I am greatly interested in the project and shall take occasion to discuss the matter with your friend Templeman." Mr. Templeman is a member of Sir Wilfrid's Government. The Colonist speaks of some pessimists who are discouraged because the matter of all-rail connection was talked of a year ago and nothing has yet been done to give it effect, and it goes on to say: "What of that? Do such people think that new projects involving great outlay can be suggested and carried into effect in a few months? How long do these people think St. John agitated for the railway across the state of Maine, now a part of the Canadian Pacific? At least ten years. Many and many a public meeting was held to pass resolutions in its favor. Many and many a delegation visited Ottawa on the subject. Ten times as many columns were written on the subject as The Colonist has written about all-rail connection. Success was achieved and St. John is now the winter port of Canada."

That is the way great improvements are brought about, and that is the spirit that works towards success in such matters. Vancouver Island will yet carry her point, and yet has not half the claims that Prince Edward Island has to all-rail connection. The far western Island is not cut off by ice as we are during five months of the year and is not loaded with intolerable freight rates as we are. There is no treaty stipulation binding the Dominion to give constant steam communication as in our case. Moreover, Vancouver Island is a part of British Columbia and the all-rail connection sought for is wholly within one Province, not inter-provincial as in our case. We must keep up the fight, let the plucky British Columbians by sheer force of energy and persistence shall get all-rail connection before we do!
