GERMANS BUILD NEW SUBMARINE EVERY WEEK NOW

PARIS, June 9.—According to reliable information received here the Germans are utilizing the big Cockerill works at Antwerp and Liege and the Cavel works at Ghent for the building of submarines, and it is estimated that the output now has reached one submarine a week.

The hull work is scattered on in the Antwerp yards of Cockerill's, while the shaping of plates, frames and angles is handled by the Liege plant. The material from Liege is forwarded to Antwerp both by river and rail. The Cavel plant, which is reported to be one of the best equipped engine building works on the continent, has been taken possession of by the Germans, and the Cavel equipment, which only recently was installed for building Diesels engines, is put to this very purpose, only that the Diesels engines go into the new German submarines.

The direction of the work at the Antwerp yards has been entrusted to German engineers drawn from the Howalt plant at Kiel and from the German works at the same place. The latter establishment forms one of the Krupp group.

The Liege shops are in charge of engineers from the Essen and Magdeburg plants of the Krupp general system, while the shops at Ghent from the Nuremberg-Nuremberg shops at Nuremberg. These latter engineers are specialists in Dissel engine construction.

THE MARKETS, JUNE 4

CHICAGO.—In the absence of any important demand for wheat the tone of the market continues weak and prices scored a further decline of 2 1/2c. to 2 3/4c. per bushel.

WONNIPPEG.—Wheat advanced in price today from 1c. to 1 1/2c. per bushel. Flax also advanced from 6c. to 7c. while oats dropped 1 1/2c.

MONTREAL.—The foreign demand for Manitoba Spring wheat here continues to be very limited, and exporters state that it is impossible to do any business at present.

CHICAGO, June 7.—This being election day in Chicago the grain and produce exchanges were closed.

WONNIPPEG, June 7.—The cash demand was extremely quiet for all grades; a light inquiry for Nos. 1, 2 and 3 wheat was in evidence only.

CHICAGO, June 7.—Wheat prices are fast coming down. Today's declines were on a large scale than any other day since the bottom began to give way, north-west market going down 7c. to 10c. Ontario No. 2 winter, \$1.32 to \$1.34 outside according to location.

MONTREAL, June 7.—The export in wheat continues dull, there being

no demand whatever from foreign buyers, but there was some enquiry for oats to-day, and sales of a few loads were made. Late Saturday a sale of 16,000 bushels of No. 3 northern was made at a price c.i.f. the Bay and to-day another sale of 14,000 bushels was made, and the difference between the price paid for the first lot and the last one was just 10 1/2c. in the buyers' favour.

There was a weaker feeling in the market for oats to-day and prices declined from 1 1/2c. to 2c. per bushel. There was no change in the baled hay situation. The market continues firm, however, with a good steady demand for supplies for local account. Hogs: There was no actual change in the conditions of the local market to-day owing to the fact that supplies coming forward are ample to fill all requirements. Live Stock: At the Montreal Stock Yards, West End Market, the receipts of live stock for the week ending June 5th were 600 cattle, 600 sheep and lambs, 1,800 hogs and 1,000 calves.

There was a stronger feeling in the market to-day, drovers demanding an advance of 2c. per 100 lbs. Eggs: The receipts of eggs to-day were 2,768 cases, as compared with 1,631 cases for the same day last week. There was no change in the condition of the local market.

MONTREAL EGG MARKET

MONTREAL, June 11.—The buyers are getting all the straight gathered stock they need at 18 cents from country points, and selling to retailers in round lots at twenty and one half cents to twenty-one cents and at twenty-two cents for small lots.
