THERE was only about 150 bbls oyster shipped by the Northumberland yesterday. The unfavorable weather since the opening of the season has considerably handicapped the fishermen.

THE funeral of the late Mrs. Walsh relict of the late Capt. James Walsh took place yesterday afternoon. Death occurred on Wednesday night after an illness of only a few weeks. Deceased was eighty years of age and a much respected lady.

The farm of Albert Gorrill of Northam was destroyed by fire on Wednesday last together with all its contents including two horses, 150 stooks of wheat, all his oat crop, some hay and farm implements. The origin of the fire is not known for a certainty but is supposed to have started from sparks from the kitchen fire igniting some straw at the rear of the barn. Mr Gorrill and his hiredman were unloading grain in the barn when the fire crept upon them with such rapidity that they scarcely had time to get the team out of the building. In endeavoring to save the stock Mr Gorrill had quite a narrow escape from being badly burned, having the hair of his head singed. As there was no insurance Mr Gorrill's loss is a heavy one.

The Railway Dining Rooms which have ever been the popular place for oysters, meals, lunches, etc, are undergoing considerable alteration and renovation. Increasing business demanding more accommodation, and with an aim to catering to the people's wants, the proprietor, Geo. P. Grady has added to his building a lean 20 ft in length. The finishing touches are now being put on by the painters and the improvements will be completed in a day or so.
