ISLAND SHIP-BUILDING.—Messrs. J.A. McDonald & Co., of Cardigan are about to lay the keel of another three masted schooner of about 150 tons. This vessel will be used primarily for the firm's own use in home waters during the summer and will be engaged in the foreign trade during the winter months. Mr. James D. McDonald of Cardigan will be the foreman of construction. The keel of a smaller vessel is already laid by the same firm. It is to be a fishing schooner of about fifty tons. She is being built for Capt. Fitzgerald of Georgetown and several others. It is expected to launch this vessel about August next. Sufficient timber is now on the ground for top construction of both vessels. It may be of interest to note that the schooner Victory Chimes built by J.A. McDonald & Co., last season is now about at Bahai, Brazil with a cargo of fish from St. John's, Nfld.
