—GIFT OF HOLLY TO ST. MARY'S CHURCH—The holly which graced the altar and pulpit amongst the Christmas decorations of St. Mary's Church, Summerside, was sent from British Columbia and is remarkable for the quantity of brilliant clusters of holly berries. One large box of this beautiful and historic festive old English decoration was sent by Mr. Charles Hensley, now of Victoria, B. C., and formerly a very prominent member of St. Mary's congregation and Superintendent of the Sunday School. The other consignment was the gift of Mrs. James, of Vancouver, B. C., in memory of her father, the late Mr. John Grady, of Summerside, who was also a member of the church. It has been the custom of Mrs. James ever since her father's death, to send the holly to the church in commemoration of the late Mr. Grady's birthday, which falls on December 24th. S.

Archdeacon White presided over the happy gathering and expressed his pleasure at seeing so many jolly faces on this festive occasion. After the good things had been thoroughly enjoyed by old and young, some jolly games were indulged in, Mr. Stavert Tanton showing the children some new games and stunts. This was followed by a short program of songs, vocal and instrumental, recitations, readings, etc. in which the children excelled and won well merited applause. —CLEVER CHECK OF RUNAWAY—On Saturday evening about dusk Mr. John Connolly of Bedouque made a very clever catch of a runaway horse just outside the station at Summerside. People who witnessed the feat said they had not seen such a neat and quick piece of work for some years on Water Street, Mr. Rufus Bagnall, also of Bedouque, had taken his horse and sleigh from the livery barn on Spring Street and was getting into the sleigh when the

rig swerved and struck the step of the Summerside laundry opposite. This startled the horse, which was a spirited animal, and he started off towards Water Street at a rapid clip, throwing Mr. Bagnall on the back in the road. Mr. Bagnall, however, did not lose his hold of the reins but hung on, being dragged along the ground. Although the horse was going at a dangerous pace Mr. Bagnall managed to keep his head clear of the ground and his feet from getting in contact with the sleigh; in this manner he was dragged along as far as the station, about 250 yards. Mr. Connolly was driving in from Bedouque with a load of pork and when he came abreast of the runaway sleigh he jumped onto the shafts and in spite of having a fur coat on, he worked his way along the rig until he reached the horse's head and pulled him up. It was a marvelous piece of work and the fact that no one was seriously hurt was due to the brave way in which Mr. Connolly and Mr. Bagnall handled a dangerous situation.
