A Vote For Beer And Wine Is A Vote For More Drunkenness

DECLARES REV. A. A. MacLEOD AT ENTHUSIASTIC TEMPERANCE MEETING AT HUNTER RIVER LAST NIGHT.

HUNTER RIVER, June 11—A representative gathering of citizens heard Rev. A. A. MacLeod, Field Secretary for the Temperance Federation at the plebiscite temperance rally held here last night. Mr. Wm. Darke presided and introduced the speaker. Mr. MacLeod said, "The citizens of the Island are again called upon to support their Prohibitory Law at the polls. On June 25th you are asked to go to the polls and decide again for or against legalizing the sale of a racial narcotic poison. We urge everyone to

not dream of voting to legalize the thing they hate, but rather should band themselves together and insist upon a strict enforcement of the finest piece of liquor legislation on the statute books of any country. The only law which really provides for the Government control of the liquor traffic is the liquor law of this Island. Its provisions strictly prohibit the manufacture, traffic and use as a beverage of all intoxicating liquors, while at the same time it provides for the sale of liquor for sacramental, mechanical and medicinal purposes. All the laws of other provinces provide for the SALE not the CON-

"In these days when we are fighting a ruthless foe with our backs to the wall, we should conserve every dollar, preserve every penny of grain and protect our people from the ravages of drink," said the speaker. "One distillery in Canada destroyed over five million bushels of grain last year in order to make whiskey. In England the brewers and distillers are being drastically curtailed, while here on the Island we are asked to vote to provide for the freer sale of intoxicants." Mr. MacLeod concluded by calling upon all to vote against any change in our prohibitory law and to press for its strict enforcement. He told the prohibitionists present that they were in good company. Dr. George Barton Cullen, Lady Astor, Irving Fisher, Roger Babson, and a host of other outstanding men and women in the religious, scientific and political world are prohibitionists. Great areas and millions of people in the world are under prohibitory liquor legislation. Don't be fooled, people of the Island. Vote to close the liquor shops, not to open more of them." Short addresses were also given in support of prohibition by the following clergymen present at the meeting: Rev. J. M. Blesedell, W. A. MacQuarrie, W. J. Phillips, and Rev. Dr. A. O. Thomson. The following committee was appointed to get out the vote and organize the polls: Wm. Darke, Mrs. Eldon Seaman, Mrs. J. S. MacLeod, Willard Sellers and Mrs. A. W. Stewart.

The cry, "While on Prince Edward Island an effort is now being made to let loose the flood of legal liquor upon our people. Prohibiting is the Government Sale provinces. COASTGUARDS IN AIRPLANE

WASHINGTON — (CP) — Flying lieutenants, trained for streamlined rescues at sea, are deploying along the coasts and waiting for tomorrow's desperate radio calls from ships in trouble.

With travel between the continents being routed more and more through the ocean air, birdmen of the coast guard are facing new and challenging conditions in preparing for deep sea rescues. The old-time breeches buoy and slow-moving cutter won't be enough. Helo must come by air, and it must come swiftly, heedless of weather conditions. Coast guard stations are being spotted along both coasts of the United States.

HEALTH REPORT

Two cases of communicable diseases were reported in Charlottetown in May. Dr. B. C. Keeping, Deputy Minister of Health, said in his monthly report to the city council last night. The cases were one of measles and the other of chicken-pox. Neither case was quarantined, the doctor said. Chest examinations for the month totalled 102, he said. Other activities of his department were listed as follows:

Laboratory examinations: Bloods Kahn; 91; Bloods Hemoglobin, 1; Bloods Complete cell count; 2; Sputum examination, 36; City Water, 26.

Veneral disease report: Cases treated: males 16; females, 8; total 24. New cases reported: males, 1; females, 2; total, 3. Total number of treatments given during the month, 72.

Public Health Nursing: Diphtheria immunizing clinics completed in all school children.

Vital statistics report: (City of Charlottetown): Births, 51; marriages, 10; deaths, 35.
