The Caledonian banquet of Thursday evening was a highly engaging festival occasion signalling the last general feast of the Clansmen in the closing century. There were many excellent short speeches in which the brightest laurels were in the general judgement awarded to the Clergymen—Messrs Fullerton, McLean Sinclair, Whiston, McConnell and Young. All were of a high order, and it is no disparagement to the others to say that in the number of its points of excellence that of Mr. McConnell touched high-water mark. Space and the exigencies of late hours prevented any report of these fine addresses in THE GUARDIAN. The tribute paid by Dr. Taylor to Dr. James McLeod was well deserved and heartily given. The city owes much to Dr. McLeod in many ways, and in bringing about the introduction of sewerage his services were inestimable. Thousands regret his long-continued illness.—It was perhaps but natural in these political times that politics gave a little of their color to one or two otherwise excellent addresses. It ought also to have been mentioned that Professor Earle played the accompaniments to the vocal music in the style of which he is a master.

Governor Roosevelt of New York has dismissed the charges against Mayor Van Wyck of New York City in the famous ice trust case. The Governor concludes that the ice trust is one in which the Mayor ought not to be stock, but that there is no evidence of his showing so willfully violated the law as to require his dismissal. It will be remembered that the ice trust, besides being a combination to increase the price of one of the necessities of life, had extensive contracts with the City thus making the Mayor, as a large stock holder, virtually a contractor with himself. The fault which Governor Roosevelt has condoned is one which in England would not be tolerated.

The Ottawa Citizen is a strongly Conservative journal. More than two thirds of the Senate of Canada is also Conservative. And yet the Citizen says: "To be frank we have more hope of Senate reform by natural than legislative causes." It is obvious that the only way in which natural causes can change or reform the Senate is by the death of its members. It is rather cold-blooded in the Citizen to "hope for Senate reform" in that way. It would none the less be interesting to learn who would be the principals in the number of first-class funerals which the Conservative organ at the Capital suggests as desirable.

The constitutionality of the prohibitory law of Manitoba is being argued in the Supreme Court of that province, the federal, and provincial Governments, with the Licensed Victuallers Association and the Dominion Alliance being represented by counsel. The Hudson's Bay Company, which claims certain imperial chartered rights to trade which it also claims cannot be abrogated by provincial legislation, is not represented at the hearing and has given notice that the Company will not be bound by the decision of the Court.

Kruger had once the reputation of being a brave man. His present bluster and bravado at a distance of thousands of miles from Lord Roberts' armies, from before which he has fled, savors neither of courage nor of wisdom. He is also rendering the worst possible service to his compatriots in South Africa by encouraging them to continue a hopeless warfare. Moreover this course is as wicked as it is useless and unwise. If Kruger were guided by the principles of the Christianity he so ostentatiously professes he would now counsel his former subjects to make peace.

Yesterday Lemuel Raagh, aged 6 was claimed and it is understood the other remaining two have contracted the whooping cough and are dangerously ill. Mrs. McLean is a sister of Mr. Ed. Carson of this city.
