THE two building lots on Upper Queen Street adjoining the residence of Peter McGrath, and owned by the estate of the late Daniel Ross, were sold yesterday to Philip Bridges and John Ross for \$250 and \$230 respectively. The auctioneer was Benj. Carter.

The general public will no doubt appreciate the dignified and disinterested attitude which the officers of the new companies have taken.

GARRIE NATION was assaulted Saturday night by J. R. Neighbor, a saloonkeeper at Elizabeth, Ky. She was ordered out of Neighbor's saloon and on returning stopped in front of the saloon and told Neighbor that he was engaged in a dirty business. Neighbor picked up a chair and struck Mrs. Nation twice, once over the head and once on the shoulder. She fled freely. Several physicians are now at her bedside, but the extent of her wounds has not been fully diagnosed.

NOT for many years has the tide of tourist travel to Cape Breton shown such a marked falling off as during the present summer. At Baddeck, which in the past seasons sheltered scores of American and Upper Canadian pleasure seekers, at this time of the year, there are at present scarcely more than a dozen of these visitors. Several reasons are advanced to account for this great falling off in the Cape Breton tourist business, the most important of these being that the World's Fair at St. Louis has drawn nearly all of those who usually spent the summer at eastern Nova Scotia resorts.

An Ottawa despatch says:—All the official and ministerial denials, carefully worded though they may be, will not convince people here that Hon. Charles Fitzpatrick is about to leave the cabinet. It is also understood that the portfolio of justice will be offered to A. B. Aylesworth of Toronto, who may or may not accept. In fact, Mr. Aylesworth has already refused a portfolio in the Laurier cabinet, and he may do so again. The probability is, however, that before many moons Mr. Aylesworth will be minister of justice and that Hon. Charles Fitzpatrick will either be chief justice of the supreme court of Canada or chief solicitor of the Grand Trunk Pacific.

ON Monday evening, Captain Riley Salvation Army, with his troupe of 12 Bermuda children, were to have given a performance at Houlton, Me., but were refused permission to cross the United States border. They returned to McAdam enroute for St. Stephen, and while waiting for train time, gave an impromptu entertainment on the spacious platform at McAdam station. A large crowd had assembled to witness the performance, the various evolutions and drills admirably rendered. Much sympathy was expressed by many of the bystanders at the treatment they had received, and it was understood that the United States government would be communicated with in this connection.—St. John Telegram; h.

R. yesterday 130 more came and the whole party leave by the I. C. R. at 6.45 this morning for Sydney en route to Port au Basque. Mr. Elstac, of the N. W. to nd land railway, is in the city looking after the transportation of the party.—Ex. Chronicle.

The management of Pictou's big sailing regatta, which is announced for August 10, has added another class in their fishing boat division. This class has been designed especially for the large "two man" fishing boats of the type that have been built so extensively in this Province in the last few years, and it is to be hoped that Island fishermen will take advantage of a race that has been arranged especially for them. The conditions that make a boat eligible for entrance are that she must not be more than thirty-four (34) feet in length over all, and that she must have been regularly engaged in fishing during the season. The prizes, though not as large as those offered in the twenty-five foot class of fishing boats, are generous, the first prize being \$30.00 and the second prize \$10.00. The entrance fee is \$1.00. The management is offering cups for several classes of yachts, and, besides the bigger yachts, especially wishes to get boats of from 16 to 20 feet waterline and from 24 to 30 feet over all to try conclusions with the excellent craft of this type in Pictou. 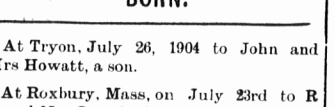
