### In Memoriam

SARAH HAYDEN MACLEOD

It is with a keen sense of sorrow and grateful appreciation that we pay this tribute of love and respect to the memory of our dear Mother. It was on April 22nd, 1937, at 8:45 P. M., while loved ones, and beings celestial kept constant vigil by her side, that her spirit glided peacefully through life's portal, and returned to God who gave it. Since last August, she had resided with her only daughter, Mrs. Lisa W. Martin of Brookline, Mass., who was her loyal companion, ministering lovingly to every need, and comforting her in her bereavement.

A funeral service was held at the home of her daughter on Sunday April 25, at 3:00 p. m. a large number of relatives, and friends attended. The Rev. William L. MacDuffie, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Brookline, Mass., officiated. He paid a fitting tribute to the life, and memory of so devoted, and so loving a mother. Mrs. Ruth MacConnell, a Soprano singer of the same church, beautifully and touchingly rendered the following solo: Safe in the Arms of Jesus; Jesus lover of My Soul. The floral gifts fully expressed the love, and esteem in which the donors held the deceased. At 8 P. M. the body was accompanied by the immediate family to the North Station Boston, Mass., and from thence by her daughter, Mrs. Martin, and her son Wallace P. MacLeod, to Prince Edward Island.

The body was carried by MacLean funeral director of Charlottetown to Dundas, on Thursday April 29th, and a service was held in the United Church at 2 P. M. with the Rev. E. Aiken of St. Peter's, officiating, and Rev. Mr. Firth pastor of the church, and the Rev. Mr. Hovey pastor of the Baptist Church assisting. The following hymns were sung by the congregation: The Lord is My Shepherd, Rock of Ages, Safe in the Arms of Jesus. The service was largely attended, the expressions of sorrow manifested over the loss of an honored citizen and loyal friend; the co-operation and sympathy offered the bereaved will ever be cherished as a memory most sacred in the hearts of those who loved her so well. After the conclusion of the service the body was borne by the pall-bearers to its final resting place; after a brief committal service they lovingly laid all that was mortal to rest by the side of her late husband. May the God of all grace grant her body sweet slumber in her native soil, and refreshment to her soul in the land of His Eternal Bliss.

The pallbearers were as follows: Messrs. A. D. Matheson, J. D. MacLean; Alex MacLean, J. M. MacLeod; Allan MacDonald; Archie MacPhee.

This late Mrs. MacLeod was the widow of Duncan MacLeod, who predeceased her a year ago the 6th of last March. She was born at St. Peter's October 15, 1845, being the daughter of John, and Margaret Hayden, she was the second child in a family of eleven. A younger sister Mrs. Eunice Shorey, of Los Angeles, Calif. is the only one who survives to mourn her loss.

The deceased was united in marriage to the late Duncan MacLeod on September 14, 1870, and with the industry and thrift of her husband acquired a comfortable home in Dundas, where they had lived for sixty years. In 1930 they retired, and from that time until her husband's death resided at St. Peter's.

The deceased was a devotee, and faithful member of the church for about seventy-four years. She had penetrated deeply into the inner shrine of Christian experience, and the foundation of her life she had laid securely upon the

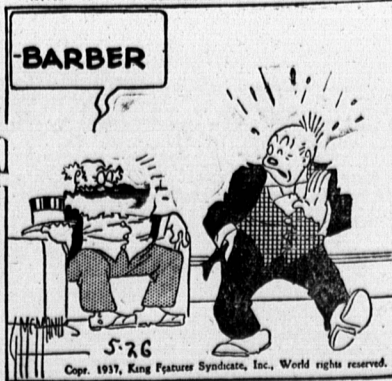

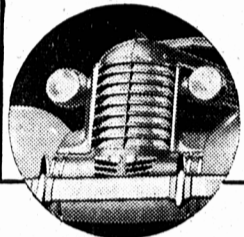

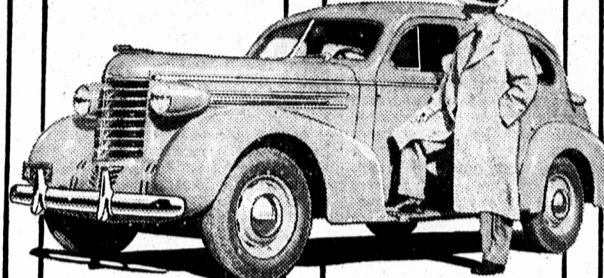
