THE schooner J. C. Schwartz went ashore at the Madeglen Islands on Friday and is likely to be a total wreck. Capt. Bruce and all the crew were saved. She was 89 tons net, valued at \$2,500 and had \$300 insurance with Hyndman & Co. It is supposed she was on her way from Grand Entry with a small part of her cargo which consisted of supplies for the Portland Packing Company.

Three of his brothers have met the fate that has overtaken so many of our East Pointers that sailed from there, the last of them Lawrence McDonald a year ago, after forty-two years of his boisterous and tempestuous life. Mrs. Eliza A. Hicks, Misses Minnie McLean and Lena Stewart left on the 27th for Boston, that place of so many of our Islanders.

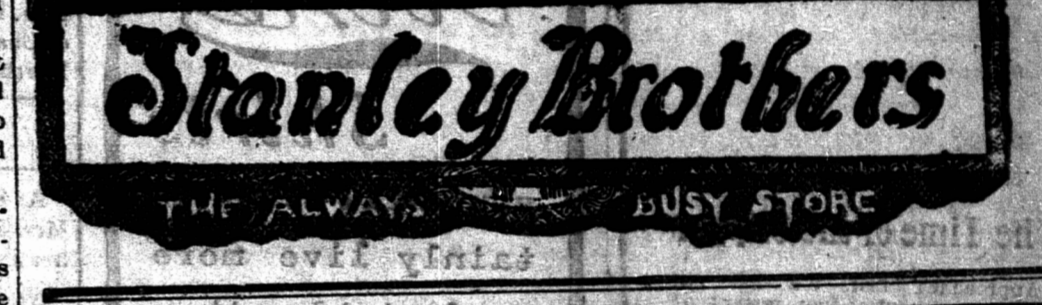
