**P. E. I. LEADS**—Fur farms are found in every province of the Dominion as well as the Yukon territory. In 1922 as shown by the Dominion bureau of statistics, there were 1,026 farms in operation, of which 977 were devoted to foxes. Fox farms increased by over 290 as compared with the previous year while there was an increase of 12 in the miscellaneous fur-bearing animal farms. Prince Edward Island led the Dominion in the number of fur farms, having 434 in 1921. Quebec came next with 146. Only 4 were found in Saskatchewan.

**Roman Catacomb Discovered in Epping Forest**

(By Dominion News Service)  
 LONDON, Oct. 24—A wonderful Roman catacomb, correct to the minutest detail, has been found in a corner of the grounds of a Cromwellian house near High Beach, in the hart of Epping Forest.

The discovery was made by Captain J. Cross, a retired master mariner, who is now managing the property, which was vacant for forty years until the present owners recently took possession.

When I was examining the grounds," said Captain Cross, "I was struck by the striking resemblance of a tower in the corner abutting on the road to the catacombs in Rome. I began excavations, and then discovered there was a lot of water below."

"I engaged engineers to pump this up a task which occupied nine days and then discovered two underground chambers.

"These are surrounded by a series of sloping stone passages and a number of stone steps. Both chambers are supported by blocks of solid stone, some of which weigh half a ton.

"The ceilings are in mosaic

work. Around the top chamber is a beautiful constructed stone balustrade.

"In one corner of the catacombs is a stalactite grotto. Alongside a miniature temple is a burial niche, which is capped with a dome of Roman architecture, which could have been only by a master builder.

"Below the two chambers which I explored there is another at a depth of about 18ft. but, so far, no means of entrance has been discovered.

"The excavators are clearing the fall of earth from the entrance of a passage which is believed to go underground, connecting up with the cellars of the house, where an entrance to a passage has already been discovered. It is possible that by way of this passage a means of access may also be found to the lower and as yet unexplored regions of the catacombs.

"The remarkable thing about this structure is that it is of Roman block-stone set in Roman cement, and that although this has been submerged for so many years, the cement is in a perfect state of preservation.

"The mystery is, who built these catacombs, and when? At least a thousand tons of stone were used in building them.

"The peculiarity of the building is that all shapes and sizes of stone have been used. Some of the blocks are carved, others plainly indicate that they have formed part of a Corinthian column."

An expert from the British Museum will inspect these catacombs shortly to fix the date when they were built.

The last occupant of the house was a Mr. Bevers, who lived the life of a recluse, but he suddenly disappeared from the neighbourhood forty years ago, and has never been heard of since.
