### THESE WORKMEN WERE GUESTS OF KING

LONDON, November 5.—At the stroke of six last evening the work of beautifying Buckingham Palace with a new front of white Portland stone, estimated to cost £20,000, was completed on the expected hour. Later the British workmen engaged in a notable undertaking. Numbering some five hundred they were seated in Holborn restaurant at a dinner, as the proud and happy guests of the king. It was a jolly, rollicking evening from the moment Sir Derek Keppel, representing the King, declared his majesty's wish that they enjoy themselves. The king sent a message congratulating the guests on their remarkable achievement and the rapidity of its execution, raising what was acknowledged to be a distinct improvement in the empire memorial to Queen Victoria. His majesty expressed regret that the queen and he were unable to be present. The workmen came in their best clothes and some displayed with pride their trade union buttons. Others wore magnificent buttonholes formed of the best flowers from their gardens.

**CORDUOYS NOT BARRED.**  
There was something very human in the appeal of a laborer who asked an official: "Do you think my corduroys will matter?"  
He was assured that corduroys were quite the thing on such an occasion.  
The dining room was decorated with masses of chrysanthemums. Canon Shepherd, domestic chaplain at Buckingham Palace, pronounced a simple grace. Then the king began to the strains of an orchestra playing ragtime. The menu consisted of typically good English fare calculated to appease the biggest appetite. It had to be submitted to the king and received his approval. The chief dishes were roast saddle of mutton and roast beef, helped down with English beer.

**SMOKED CLAY PIPES.**  
During the dessert Keppel announced: "Gentlemen, you may smoke." By the side of each man was a new clay pipe of wonderful design, presented by the king, with a packet of good strong tobacco, bearing the Royal Arms, and inscribed, "From H. M. the King." It was noticeable that many put the packet safely into their pockets as a memento, and brought out twigs of their own tobacco. When the dinner was completed the workmen, standing, sang in deep-throated voices, "God Save the King," followed by "For he's a jolly good fellow."  
The evening finished with a short concert. The workmen included masons, laborers, bricklayers, carpenters, and lift directors. Many came in new caps, two in straw hats, and a number in "bowlers." Those with caps had an advantage, for they had not to face the mysteries of the cloak-room, they simply put their caps in their pockets and kept them to wave in the air when they cheered their host, after singing "God Save the King."

### THREE NOVA SCOTIANS BELIEVED PERISHED

PORTLAND, Me., Nov. 5.—Ten men picked up at sea in two dories after thirty hours without food and water and, according to reports, were brought in here tonight by the four-masted schooner Titon with a harrowing tale of marlin disaster which probably cost the lives of their own captain and three others, and the known loss of their cook who was washed from a dory and drowned in sight of all before on Saturday night last. The men are of the fishing schooner Annie M. Parker, owned by Gorton & Pew of Gloucester, Mass. and commanded by Captain Vincent Nelson, of Beverly, Mass. She carried a crew of fifteen.

**STRUCK ALEDGE.**  
Leaving Gloucester August 6 for the Quere fishing banks, the Parker returned to Sydney, C. B., and left there Oct. 26 for Gloucester, immediately running into the northwesterly gale which blew her well off her course, assisted by the current. They followed a west, half south, course and brought up very early last Saturday morning off Nanticket. At 2.30 in the morning a light was sighted which proved to be Sankaty Head. The man at the wheel misjudged his distance and the schooner, running at a seven knot clip, brought up sharply on Rose and Crown Ledge, twelve miles to the seaward of Sankaty Ledge.

**ALL BELIEVED LOST.**  
High seas broke over her and, thinking her sinking, the crew began hasty preparations to leave. The first dory put over the lee side was smashed, the second filled, but the third was launched and eight men got aboard. The other dories were then launched over the windward side, one with three aboard and the other and last with the captain and three.

In the last dory was Captain Nelson and Lester Fletcher, of Argyle Sound, N. S., Ross Worthen of Pubnico Head, N. S., and Thomas Landry of Arichat, C. B. The first two dory loads saw the captain's dory wallowing in the trough of the sea at the bow of the schooner and then it disappeared. All four occupants are believed lost.

dories were far apart, doing their best to keep aloft though the men were hungry and poorly clad most of them only in underclothes and oil skins. Both dories leaked badly and all each had with them to bail was an oil skin hat apiece. The dories finally worked their way together and managed to shift two from the dory with eight into the other dory, giving that one a human freight of six.
