MONTREAL, June 24.—The office of James Thom, the Montreal agents of the Canada line, received the following cable shortly before eleven o'clock this morning from the Antwerp office: "Gothland making water one and two holds; tugs assisting; condition dangerous; all passengers landed and proceeding to Rotterdam; part of crew landed."

The Gothland when she cleared from Montreal on June 12th, carried 214,538 bushels of grain for Rotterdam and sixty tons of general cargo.

**OCEAN LIMITED DELAYED FOR THREE HOURS**

MONCTON, June 24.—An accident happened to the eastbound Ocean Limited near Memramcook today which delayed traffic for three hours. The fore hokey on the refrigerator car, next the engine, left the rails and turned cross-wise on the track, running in that way for a quarter of a mile. Every sleeper was cut in the middle, the outer ends being untouched. All the other cars kept the track. The engine broke loose and ran for some distance.

A wrecking gang was sent out from Moncton and section men from College Bridge got to work. The outgoing Ocean Limited was delayed for three hours by the accident. The refrigerator was taken on at Truro and contained fresh fish for Boston.
