

A story is going about the street now that the important German interests were made aware of the coming of a week before the New York Stock Exchange closed and realized the opportunity to dump enormous lines of international rails here. One report goes so far as to intimate that this condition is one of the reasons holding up the present re-opening of the London and New York Exchanges, it being vaguely suggested that the financial interests of England, France and America are "GUNNING" for the German Bear Party. This sounds very much like some of the war fake, however, and is given for what it may be worth.

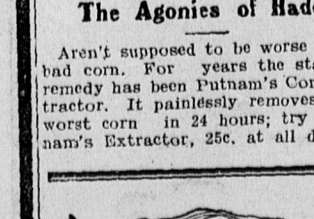
