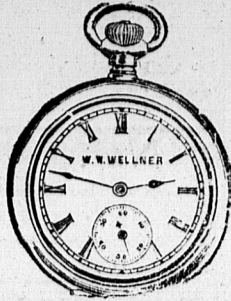

The prices of the club championship of the Minto Club were skated for at the Arena, Ottawa, on Monday the 11th. Much interest was taken in the event, and spectators thronged the rink. In the junior ladies' singles, the Havoock cup was won by Miss Mary Davies, of Charlottetown.

Referring to the death of the late Senator Macdonald of Charlottetown, in the Senate at Ottawa on Friday Hon Mr. Loughheed, as leader, expressed his sense of the loss the Senate has sustained through the death of Senator Macdonald, one of the Fathers of Confederation. Sir Richard Cartwright said he endorsed all Hon Mr. Loughheed had said. Senator Macdonald had in his life been of use to his country.

As announced yesterday an application for commutation of sentence of Tony Garrio, sentenced to die on May 2nd, is being circulated through the city and county. This move has been the cause of a great deal of discussion. It is talked of in cars, hotels and everywhere in which men may happen to gather. Opinions expressed are mostly opposed to commutation. One prominent business man said to the Post yesterday: "I have not the slightest doubt but that the application will be turned down. Why, capital punishment might as well be abolished for ever if every man sentenced to die is later given a commutation of sentence." Some others seem to think that life sentence would be severer punishment for Garrio.—Sydney McLaren of this Province and was convicted at his trial recently.)

The examinations in the Faculties of Arts, Science and Law at McGill University, Montreal, where a large number of P. E. I. students are studying, will start on April 16th, and convocation will take place on May 10th. Already there is considerable discussion among the students as to where the class day exercises and convocation should be held. Last year hundreds of the friends of the students were unable to gain admission to the Royal Victoria College Hall, where the convocation took place, and the students think that with a view to preventing this occurring again, a larger hall, such as His Majesty's Theatre should be secured. In regard to the 'class day', which takes place two days before convocation, and agitation is on among the students to have the exercises held on the campus, if the weather is at all suitable.

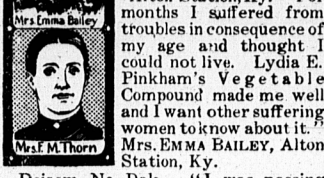
